BILL HAYS AND DEREK TINKER Switch Energy Alliance





Pursuing A Smart Energy Future. Energy underpins all aspects of modern life, and the lack of energy inhibits over 2.5 billion people from entering into modern life, but most people really don't understand energy. **Derek Tinker** and **Bill Hays** of Switch Energy Alliance (SEA), an Austin-based non-profit, will analyze difficult energy questions: What kinds of energy will actually address climate change globally and at scale? What are the options to lift 1/3 of the world from energy poverty and the impacts of doing so? What is the "energy transition" and can it happen quickly?

Switch Energy Alliance (SEA) is an Austin-based non-profit whose mission is to inspire an energy-educated future. Building on the global energy film *Switch*—viewed in over 50 countries by 15 million people—SEA develops world class film and serves it via state-of-the-art web delivery. SEA has programs that reach K-12, higher education, professionals and the public.

Bill Hays joined Switch Energy Alliance in May 2018 and acts as SEA's Director of Operations. Prior to joining SEA, Bill had a 35-year career as a corporate attorney in private practice and as in-house counsel with Citigroup and Nissan.

Derek Tinker joined Switch Energy Alliance in August 2016 after completing a Master's degree in Petroleum Engineering at the University of Texas – Austin. Derek is the Director of Technology at SEA and is responsible for building and maintaining SEA's website (www.switchon.org).

RECAP FROM LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Karen Aston—Head Coach, University of Texas' Women's Basketball Team May 14, 2019 Reported by Girish Altekar

President Julie called the meeting to order. **Jim Innes** led the pledges and **Carl Noble** gave our invocation of the day. **Jon Yates** led us in saying the *Four Way Test*. **Nick Hesselsweet** greeted each member and guest as they arrived and **Carl Noble** stepped back up to the podium to introduce our guests and visitors.

Congratulations to **John Fox** (PHF +2), **Pauline Gubbels** (PHF +8) and **Debbie Simmons** (PHF +2)! We appreciate your continued support of The Rotary Foundation!

Past President Sara Pantin described her Rotary journey that started 26 years ago in California during the *Membership Minute*. She joined the Silicon Valley Club as a corporate executive to network and stayed on for a decade after she found herself attracted by service and the people, ending as the President of their Club. She came back to Austin around 2001, joined our Club and has served in many roles, including Club President of the Rotary Club of Austin in 2017! She currently serves on our Foundation's Board of Trustees.

Tillery Castillo reminded us about the Spring Garden and Membership Party that the Benkoski's are hosting at their house this Saturday.

Caroline Valentine announced our Club's inaugural Global Perspectives Dinner which will be held at Napa Flats Wood-Fired Kitchen on May 23rd.

President Julie reminded us to check-in on Meetup and Facebook, and she also reminded us about the Mastermind Group Meeting coming up this Thursday morning as well as the EarlyAct FirstKnight (EAFK) knighting ceremonies coming up at Pecan Springs and Dawson Elementary Schools on Friday.

We heard about two **SAVE THE DATE** events coming up soon – Our annual *Changing of the Guard Party* will be on **June 26**th at Matt's El Rancho and the *Back-to-School Splash Bash* that we host every year at the Helping Hand Home for Children is coming up on Saturday, **July 27**th!

They are engaged in their sport for nearly the entire year, including the summer months when they also take extra courses to catch up with their academics. Coach remarked that this year her team has been fun to watch with an attractive playing style, and next year they will be even better as three potential starters recover from their injuries. She invited us to come see them at a game and get to know the players!

Coach Aston's coaching philosophy is that being a part of the team must be something that you are passionate about because it will change your life. Her job is to teach "her girls" about the 4Cs: Commitment, Communication, Care and Character as the driving characteristics of a successful team.

She concluded that it takes special kids to succeed both in UT academics and basketball, and she would like to work with us to involve her team in volunteering in some of our community service activities since they enjoy "giving back" in addition to playing basketball. *Story continues on page 5.*





ST. DAVID'S PARKING GARAGE MESSAGE/INSTRUCTIONS



Premier Parking/St. David's garage manager, Angel, will provide 50 parking spaces in St. David's garage every Tuesday for our use, although they may or may not be roped off for us. Once those spaces are taken and there are no other parking spaces members should either try to find parking on the surface lot on the church property, if there are any spaces available, OR...

Drive over to Premier's Trinity surface lot which is on Trinity and 8th, catty-corner to St. David's parking garage. (It's the corner lot that is steeply slanted — see map image to the left.) You may also start there, if you'd like. If you park in this surface lot, go to the kiosk (on the lot) and punch in the numbers, 1905. You will not be charged for parking in either the small, surface lot on the church campus nor this

Trinity surface parking lot.

Please continue to use your laminated barcode to enter the parking garage and don't punch the button for a paper ticket. Our code is read by the parking system and an accurate count of members will be reported. If you have a guest coming, they will take a paper ticket and then they will need to ask the Hospitality Team, when they check in, for a one-time use QR code to exit the garage. If any of your guests park in Premier's Trinity surface lot then they will need to punch in the numbers **1905** at the kiosk, too.

Club leaders continue to try to identify alternative parking solutions for us and welcome any suggestions from members.

AUSTIN CENTRE—OVERFLOW PARKING REMINDER

Don't forget that we still have an agreement with Austin Centre (the building right across San Jacinto from the Church...think the Omni, but not - see map image to the bottom right) where they will try to provide overflow parking in their garage on (most) Tuesdays during our weekly lunches!

This garage is MUCH more expensive for us than when you park in St. David's garage (or in the Trinity


Surface Lot), however, since they charge us in 20 minute

increments (not a flat rate).

If you park in the Austin Centre garage, you MUST request a validation ticket from one of the Hospitality members when you check in at the meeting! Please note that this is ONLY AVAILABLE from 11:00-2:00 each Tuesday and is unavailable on any other day of the week.

To enter the Austin Centre parking garage, come down 7th Street and turn left onto Brazos. parking garage entrance is on the right.

If you park there, don't forget to ask the Hospitality Team for a complimentary validation voucher/ticket! YOUR LAMINATED BARCODES WON'T WORK IN THIS GARAGE!
