#### Welcome to December!

It has been a pleasure traveling eastern Missouri visiting our District's Rotary Clubs. Mike and I are amazed at all the service projects supporting the local communities, big and small. I must say we have quite a scenic district.

Have you taken advantage of the District's Matching Program for the Annual Fund of The Rotary Foundation? You can reach your first Paul Harris Fellow or strive for your next PHF with matching recognition points. Check out the article for all the details.

With The Rotary Foundation giving from three years ago, our District was able to grant \$45,000 to our Clubs. In turn, the Clubs multiplied those funds to provide over \$100,000 worth of impact to our communities and world. There are projects such as park improvements, car seats, food, books, digital equipment, beds, band instruments, hygiene supplies, coats, shoes, and water systems. More giving equals more funded projects!

Our District is stepping up for the 2023-24 Charitable Initiatives. Twenty-six clubs participated in the **Empowering Girls Gifts** this year. Some highlights are in last month's newsletter. Make sure to apply for this free money next year.

After 43 of the 49 club visits, we have collected nearly 14,600 pairs of shoes to benefit **Shoes for Orphan Souls**. Our goal is 20,000 pairs by April 20, 2024, so don't let up now. Check out the sales while you are out holiday shopping. For the **Navajo** 

Water Project, fifteen Rotary Clubs have donated \$6,942 so far. Our goal is \$9,000 to provide the complete water system for two homes in Navajo Nation. That is just \$5 per D6060 Rotarian. #### **ANNUAL FUND MATCHING PROGRAM 2023-2024**

Starting October 15, 2023 through January 15, 2024, your donations to the Annual Programs Fund will be matched with Recognition Points!

With a focus on helping all District 6060 Rotarians reach their first Paul Harris Fellowship(PHF) level, we will be matching 2 points for each dollar, for any donors that have not reached their first PHF. All donations \$50 to \$500 will be matched for these not yet PHF members.

All other Rotarians that have reached PHF will have donations from \$100 to \$500 matched at .5 points for every \$1. Make a minimum donation of \$100 up to \$500 to the Annual Programs Fund via check or directly to the Foundation on MyRotary.org and you will receive a matching contribution from Rotarians who have donated their points to support you.

At this moment, we plan to have 40,000 donated points to share with members not yet reaching their first PHF and another 15,000 for others! Any unused points from either group may be redistributed in January to further incentivize our annual giving.

All checks must be sent to Brian for proper processing to get this matching credit.





### **NEW FROM ROTARY INTERNATIONAL ABOUT LEARNING**

As part of our action plan, which calls for us to put participants at the center of all we do, Rotary is changing our approach from a training model to a learning model. In practice, this means that members will have more active involvement in their learning and more control over it. It also means that the people who lead Rotary learning experiences will serve more as facilitators who guide members to share their ideas than as lecturers who tell members information they think they should know.

When the RI board approved our focus on learning, they also agreed to change these titles as of 1 July 2023:

Please note this is a work in progress and more changes are coming. Rotary's Learning Committee will continue to consider what is needed to fully move us from training to learning and will make recommendations to the RI Board.

It includes changes to titles and events. Some of our event titles will require changes through the Council on Legislation (COL), such as President-elect Training Seminar (PETS) and District Training Assembly. We'll work on this for the next few years with the Learning Committee, the Board, and the COL to continue to improve.

#### **STE GENEVIEVE ROTARY TURNS 50!**

The Ste. Genevieve Rotary Club celebrated their 50th anniversary on Oct. 26th . Club president Jami Drury invited all Rotarians and their guests to enjoy a reception and program highlighting the club's accomplishments. Long standing Rotarians were honored for their service.

An organizational meeting for the club was held at Cafe Genevieve on September 16, 1973. The charter was issued by Rotary International on November 2, 1973.

Mayor Brian Keim signed a proclamation designating November 2, 2023, as "Ste. Genevieve Rotary Club Day" in the City of Ste. Genevieve. During his signing, he said Rotary is far-reaching and he, as a fellow Rotarian, is excited about what Rotary has accomplished during the past 50 years. Activities have included awarding of local scholarships, providing eco-friendly benches around town, and the construction of a welcome sign on Highway 32. The local club has planted trees along Progress Parkway, provided a gazebo at Bicentennial Plaza.

They also have annual food drives and support Reading Express. The iconic duck races that are staged during Jour de Fete began in 1999 and are the second largest fundraiser for the club behind an annual golf tournament.

The club has been recognizing students of the month from both Valle and Ste. Genevieve high schools since 1974.

The club has also heard from hundreds of community leaders, businesses and individuals on local projects, community affairs, unique professions and hobbies.

One of the first speakers was Eddie Stewardbird, an instructor at the time at Jefferson Junior College in Hillsboro – his presentation was on the pros and cons of the Alaskan pipeline.



Members of the Ste. Genevieve Rotary Club were present for the Mayoral Proclamation designating November 2, 2023 as Ste. Genevieve Rotary Club Day in Ste. Genevieve, in honor of the club's 50th anniversary. The club has 48 members and are open to increasing their membership.


#### ROTARY DISTRICT 6060 RECEIVES BRONZE HERO AWARD
