- Establish trust and maintain confidentiality
- · Provide guidance and encouragement
- Expose her to positive new ways of thinking and living
- Share personal experiences and perspective

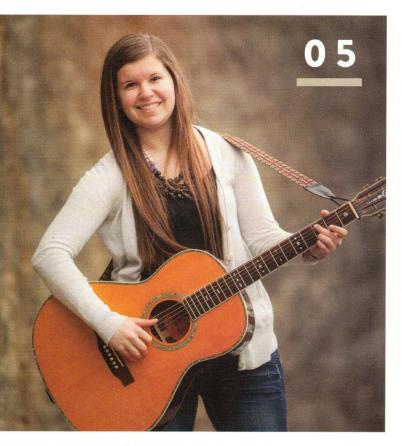

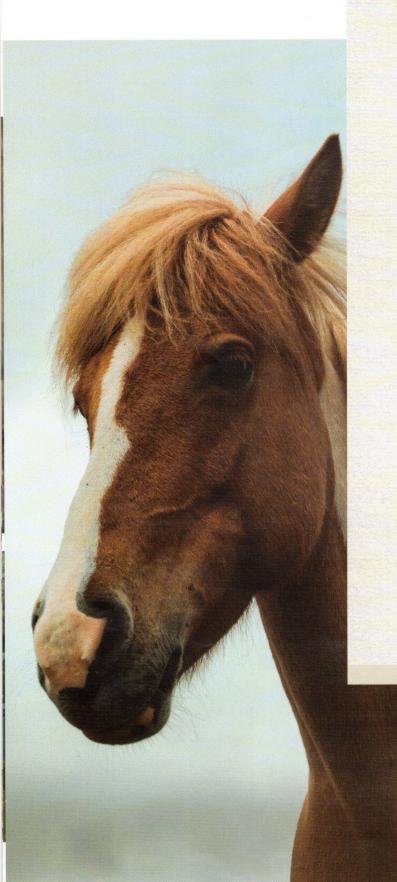

## Hey Friend,

As I write this note to you, the weather is absolutely gorgeous here at the farm this week.

One of the most beautiful things about life at the farm with "Grace" is how caring for animals invites us to a slower and more intentional headspace. Horses can't be hurried... unless you have a bucket of grain! However, their slow pace in life creates an opportunity for each of us to be intentional about movement and to be aware of our breathing and heart rate when we are interacting with them. Horses have a very stable heart rhythm, so naturally, "Grace" feels calmer when she's around the herd. As you get farther into this issue of "Grace Repurposed," you'll read how Equine Assisted Therapy and our Stable Time is changing the very heartbeat of the girls we serve.

This week, the girls in the Pink Shirt phase of our program had "stable time." This two-hour period each week is all about trying something new, bravely facing their fears, managing emotions, and deep healing. The last few weeks,

"Grace" was only willing to do ground work with her horse, but this week was different. She decided to take a brave step and sit in the saddle after she'd worked so hard to get Winchester saddled up. She'd planned on climbing on, then right back down, but instead stayed mounted and rode him around the arena.

She did it afraid, and that 20 minutes built up her courage and confidence, unlike anything she had ever experienced.

We believe, because we've seen it proven to be true, that good experiences heal bad experiences. This moment reminded me of Proverbs 4:26 (ESV), it says, "Ponder the path of your feet; then all your ways will be sure".

Friend, this is only one story about what God is doing out here on these sacred acres through your support. I'm so thankful for you. I'm so thankful that you are taking the time to read through this edition. Grace Farms belongs to the Lord but also to you. I hope you'll find time to visit us soon if it's been a while. I'd love that so much!

WHEN AUTUMN JOINED
THE PROGRAM AT SAVING
GRACE, SHE FELT AS
THOUGH SHE WERE
DROWNING IN TRAUMA,
HESITANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE

Autumn experienced abuse and neglect in her young life. She lost her mother in elementary school, which led to years in foster care and an unhealthy adoption before her arrival at Saving Grace. Living in survival mode, Autumn paved her road through confusing pathways. Autumn discovered a safe haven at Saving Grace, where she was welcomed with tough and tender love. This provided Autumn with an opportunity she hadn't realized she needed.

Upon reflection, Autumn knows that God orchestrated everything for her ultimate good during a crucial period in her life. When asked about the lessons God had taught her about the significance of showing up for others, especially in life's messiness, she said this. "Nothing can replace showing up. The pivotal chapters of my story bear the names of the people who were simply there written all over them. Lori picked me up for school. Margaret helped me pass my classes. Stephanie taught me how to grocery shop, and Brad and Leila covered many meals. Natalie cared for my heart and mind, while LaRay attended to my physical needs."

"The THINGS were important at the time, but the people who kept showing up when I needed them most made the difference. I don't remember every detail of every day, but I remember the people who walked with me."

The individuals placed in her path were the hands and feet of Jesus and significantly impacted her life. Overflowing with gratitude, Autumn composed a beautiful song expressing thanks to those who had personally invested in her life.

"It's no secret that God has worked miracle after miracle in my life. As I grow older, this truth settles deeper into my soul. I would be nothing without the many people He sovereignly placed in my path when I felt too lost to be found. The ones who picked me up, fed me, clothed me, held me, cried with me, and spoke truth over me when I so desperately needed it. Those who loved me when I was both innocent and guilty. Those who chose to come AND stay no matter what it looked like. In this season of gratitude, I've been thinking: If He calls us to 'enter His gates

with thanksgiving and His courts with praise,' what would it look like if I took a moment to give thanks, myself? To tell the story of one of God's greatest mercies in my life — the people from my testimony who loved me like Jesus. The people who led me here. 'Thank you' doesn't seem like enough. But I am who I am and where I am today because you were the hands and the feet of Jesus. I pray to one day be half of everything you've been to me — you were Jesus, and I am grateful."

Autumn's journey celebrates each person who filled a gap in her life and loved her as Jesus does. Each hard and brave step of her story led her to freedom in Christ and a passion to be the hands and feet of Jesus like others were for her.

"God doesn't need much, just hands and feet and willing hearts—He can work with that."

The lasting effects of generational change extend far beyond the acres of Grace Farms. God often plants seeds that are then watered and nurtured by "Grace's" mentors, friends and others He intentionally places in her life.

Sometimes we cannot grasp the fullness of God's plans until years later, when He gives us a beautiful glimpse into what He was up to all along.

Autumn reached out last winter with a heartfelt note and beautiful card directing us to a song she composed expressing gratitude for those God placed in her life. Friend, YOU were a part of the community that

God provided for her. You were Jesus.

The vision of Saving Grace started out as a tiny seed of a dream that God placed in the heart of our founder and Executive Director, Becky Shaffer. Soon, that dream grew into "The Little House on Poplar" —the special place we first called home!

That seed then sprouted into a healthy plant that we watered, pruned, and cared for until God said that it was time to grow out of that 8,000-square-foot home. Last Summer, we moved Saving Grace to our beautiful 50-acre farm, Grace Farms, and the fruit continues to grow!

Grace Farms is home to nine amazing horses that support "Grace" in therapy—helping her grow in confidence and heal from past trauma. On any given day, you can find "Grace" in the stable grooming horses, sharing treats, or working with them in the arena! our small flock, "Grace" is able to learn what it looks like to care for other living things. Our hens rely on her to show up and reap the reward: eggs that can be used in our nutrition and cooking classes!

The gardens provide both healthy vegetables and beautiful flowers for "Grace" to enjoy and tend to.

Most importantly, "Grace" gains the experience of starting small and watching growth occur around her. In the process, growth and healing happens within her, too.

Phase I was completed in Summer 2023 and allowed Saving Grace to move our current program entirely to Grace Farms. Phase II. the renovation of Grace House, is 60% funded and will enable us to grow from serving 12 girls at a time to 28.
