The Tulsa Sunrise Rotary Club Foundation Educational Grant Guidelines

<u>Intent</u>: The Tulsa Sunrise Rotary club Foundation Educational Grant Program has been established to support post-secondary school education for those in financial need. Specifically, it is intended to benefit "those students who might fall through the cracks" of other scholarship and grant-in-aid programs.

Guidelines of the Program:

- 1. The Foundation Board will consider only applications made for funding a single academic year or term
- 2. No specific amount of funding per award is set. Award amounts will be determined on a caseby-case basis, as well as by the amount of funds available and the number of awards granted
- 3. Any qualified person can apply to the Educational Grant Program. Applicants cannot be directly related to a member of Sunrise Rotary, to avoid conflicts of interest. Direct relative would be defined as children, grandchildren, great grandchildren, parents, grandparents, step children, brothers, sisters, and spouses.
- 4. Advertisement of the program will be made by announcements during regularly Sunrise Rotary Club meetings and by word-of-mouth. Sunrise Rotarians are encouraged to nominate deserving candidates
- 5. To be considered for an award, students must submit a completed application form and all required supporting documentation in order to establish their qualifications and adherence to the intent of the Program. A copy of the application is attached.
- 6. Applicants requesting funding for additional terms may be approved at the Board's discretion. Proof of satisfactory academic progress must be submitted with all requests for additional term funding.

<u>Qualifications</u>: General qualifications for scholarship consideration follow:

- 1. An actual financial need must exist
- 2. A Sunrise Educational Grant should not diminish the amount of other scholarship awards
- 3. The applicant must have earned, as a minimum, a high school diploma or a GED
- 4. If the applicant does not have post-secondary educational experience, but does have a high school diploma, the high school record must reflect a 2.5 GPA (out of 4.0)
- 5. If the applicant has post-secondary education, the technical, trade school or post-secondary school must be located in Oklahoma and records should reflect a GPA of 2.5 (out of 4.0).

<u>Application Process</u>: The Foundation Board requires completion of a standardization application form and associated documentation to be submitted to it for consideration. This includes the submitting of a copy of the high school transcript of GED, whichever is applicable. The Board's decisions are determined by majority vote and are final. **Application must be received by June 30**th when applying for a Fall Semester Scholarship or November 1st for a Spring Semester Scholarship.

Include your high school/GED transcript and/or transcripts of all courses taken since high school. Copies are acceptable. Enclose a copy of your acceptance letter to the school you will be attending if you are currently enrolled.

Conditions and Terms of Agreement

Grant-in-Aid funds cannot be used for expenses incurred before the period covered by the grant. If you are selected as a recipient of a Foundation grant, you:

- 1. Agree that your name and photograph may be used in publicity at the Foundation's discretion
- 2. Acknowledge that all of the information in this application is true and complete to the best of your knowledge
- 3. Understand that this application will not be considered for review unless all requested materials are enclosed and the application is signed
- 4. Understand that not every eligible applicant will receive a grant
- 5. Understand that all applications will be held confidential, but no application material will be returned

Applications are evaluated on your documentary financial need, description of career plans and goals, and academic, employment and volunteer record. A majority of applicants who apply for a grant meet all eligibility criteria and are deserving of financial assistance; however, the Foundation is not obligated to award grants to any or all eligible applicants. All applicants, whether awarded a grant or not, will be notified by August 1 for the Fall term or December 1 for the spring term. Applications must be submitted 60 days prior to these deadlines in order to be considered.
