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Do the Following:

Set up an account on DACdb – Contact Janie Keleher, Club Secretary, for assistance o Log in and go to My DATA tab at the top of the page <u>District Database - DACdb log in</u> o Click on Edit Member in the menu on the left

o Update your contact and personal information, photo, etc using the tabs at the top of the page

- Set up a MyRotary account in Rotary.org Contact Janie Keleher, Club Secretary, for assistance
 - o Go to myrotary.org
 - o Using the yellow button on the page, GO TO PROFILE
 - o Verify/update your profile
 - o Go back and explore MyRotary, paying particular attention to resources under the Learning & Reference tab at the top of the page.
- □ Get Involved
 - o Attend a Daybreak Rotary Club "Fireside Chat" orientation session.

o Attend a Daybreak Rotary Club Board meeting. Meet the leaders and observe a board business meeting.

o Review our committees and service projects<u>Daybreak Rotary Service Areas</u> o Discuss potential project involvement with your Rotary Sponsor (member who invited you to joining Daybreak Rotary)

o Select at least one Service Project or Youth Services and contact the committee chair to discuss membership and duties. Get the chair to add you to the committee list.

o Understand that there will be opportunities throughout the year to lead or participate in smaller projects and fundraisers (e.g. Gourmet Grilled Cheese Competition, Pints for Polio, etc), and a need to participate in bigger events like Fantasy Land of Lights and Afghan We Can.

You should also sign up on the rotational schedule to assist in Friday Meetings: o (?Consider initiating this 'greeter' position to help sergeant-of-arms?) Greeter – Welcome members and guests to the meeting. Monitor the guests sign in and the club meeting activities sign up (Pledge, Invocation, 4-Way Test, Song) to assist the sergeant-of-arms' greetings & the President's announcements of members doing the meeting activities.
