BY-LAWS

Article I, Section 1—Election of Directors and Officers

(Insert in the spaces provided hereunder information regarding the plan adopted by the club for election of directors and officers, crossing out the plan not adopted. NOTE: If the alternative plan is adopted it provides for the immediate past president to be a member of the board of directors. Since there will be no immediate past president at the time of organization, the club may, if it desires, elect an extra director for the first year.)

Article I

~~Section I—At a regular meeting one month prior to the meeting for election of officers, nominations shall be called for by the presiding officer for candidates for the board of directors; any number of nominations may be made by the members from the floor. These nominations shall be placed upon a ballot and voted for at the annual meeting and the candidates securing the highest number of votes shall be declared elected.~~

Article I—Alternative Plan

Section I—At a regular meeting one month prior to the meeting for election of officers, the presiding officer shall ask for nominations by members of

the club for president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and 4 members of the board of directors. The nominations may be presented by a nominating committee or by members from the floor, by either or by both, as the club may determine. If it is determined to have a nominating committee, such committee shall be appointed as the club may determine. The nominations duly made shall be placed on a ballot in alphabetical order under each office and shall be voted for at the annual meeting. The candidates for president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer receiving a majority of the votes shall be declared elected to their respective offices. The 4 candidates for director receiving a majority of the votes shall be declared elected as directors. The president elected in such balloting shall serve as a member of the board as president-elect for the year commencing on the first day of July next following his election as president, and shall assume office as president on the first day of July immediately following his year of service on the board as president-elect.

Articles II and IV (Same plan to be adopted as in Article I.)

(Note: If the alternative plan in Article I has been adopted, it is necessary to adopt the alternative plan in Articles II and IV.)

Article IV—Meetings

Section 1—Annual meeting. An annual meeting of this club shall be held on the 2ND week of the
(1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th)

month of JULY in each Rotary year, at which time the election of directors to serve for the ensuing year shall take place (not later than 31 December).

Section 2—The regular weekly meeting of this club shall be held on TUESDAY at 7:00 A.M.
(day) (time)

Section 4—Regular meetings of the board shall be held on THE FIRST TUESDAY of each month.
(please indicate which week and day)

Article V—Fees and Dues

Section 1—The admission fee shall be \$ 20⁰⁰.

Section 2—The membership dues shall be \$ 34⁰⁰ per annum.
(The Board of Directors of Rotary International will not admit to membership in Rotary International any club in the United States of America and Canada that does not have an admission fee and annual membership dues of at least \$20.00 and \$25.00 U.S. currency, respectively. In other countries, the admission fee and annual membership dues should be equivalent in purchasing power in local currency to at least \$20.00 and \$25.00 U.S. currency, respectively.)

Article XI—Method of electing members

(Note: Insert in the spaces provided hereunder the appropriate number.)

Section 1—Active members (including additional active members). Paragraph 5 "...If not to exceed 3 negative votes are cast by the members of the board in attendance at such regular or special meeting, the proposed member, upon payment of the prescribed admission fee, shall be considered to be elected to membership...".

Section 2—Senior Active, Past Service, and Honorary Members "... If not to exceed 3 negative votes are cast by the members of the board in attendance at the regular or special meeting, the proposed member shall be considered duly elected...".

The foregoing information concerning club By-laws refers to the By-laws recommended by the Board of Directors of R.I. Unless these recommended By-laws are adopted by the club without modification, the full text of the By-laws as adopted by the club must be attached to this document.

To the Governor of District No. 617 :

I certify that the officers and members of this club understand the fundamental characteristics of Rotary as described in the application for membership form, and the provisions of the Constitution and By-laws adopted by the club. The charter members possess all the qualifications for membership in a Rotary club in accordance with the constitutional provisions.

UNDERSTANDINGS AND AGREEMENTS

1. As our constitution, we have adopted the Standard Rotary Club Constitution prescribed by Rotary International. This Club understands that the club constitution can be amended only by legislative process of Rotary International, or (under certain circumstances for exceptional reasons) by the Board of Directors of Rotary International, in accordance with Section 2(d), Article I, of the By-laws of R.I. No amendment to the By-laws adopted by this club which might conflict with the Constitution of the club or with the Constitution and By-laws of Rotary International will be made without first submitting such proposed amendment to the General Secretary of Rotary International for approval by its Board of Directors.
2. This Club will be bound by any and all amendments to the Standard Rotary Club Constitution which may be adopted hereafter (as provided in Article I, Section 2(b), of the By-laws of Rotary International, and in Article XVI of the Constitution of this club).
3. In accordance with Article XII of its Constitution this club shall collect from each member semi-annually, in advance and upon receipt of invoice, the subscription fee to the official magazine and remit such fees to the Secretariat of Rotary International. (If the Board of Directors of Rotary International has approved and prescribed a regional magazine for this club, fees for subscription to such approved and prescribed regional publication should be sent to the office of such publication.) New clubs in countries listed on the next page are excused from compliance with the requirements of Article XII of the Standard Rotary Club Constitution.
4. **NO FURTHER MEMBERS** will be elected between the filing of this application and the receipt of the official notice of the admission of the club to membership in Rotary International.
5. This club, as a club, will not become a member of, or assume obligations of membership in any organization other than Rotary International.
6. This club is hereby pledged, in its desire to develop true Rotarians and a Rotary club that will function properly as a unit in Rotary International, to maintain the following fundamental characteristics of Rotary:
 - a. Rotary is a world fellowship of business and professional men banded together in Rotary clubs for the purpose of encouraging the practical application of the ideal of service both individually and collectively—with emphasis on the individual.
 - b. Rotary is concerned with the development, encouragement, and fostering of understanding, goodwill, and peaceful relations among people throughout the world based upon the ideal of service.
 - c. A Rotary club selects its members on the basis of classification of their vocations in order to assure a broad representation of the community's life and further the Object of Rotary.
 - d. Attendance at regular club meetings is required at least to a stated minimum for the continuance of membership so that acquaintance and fellowship may be developed as a first step toward lasting friendships.
 - e. Rotary clubs provide members with opportunities to exemplify high ethical standards in their personal and business or professional activities.
 - f. The religious and political beliefs of a Rotarian are regarded as being of his own concern.
