Overall Role: Pursuant to Article V11 section 2 (b) of the bylaws this committee shall devise and carry into effect plans, which will guide and assist the members of this club in recognizing individuals and organizations working to make the community a better place to live and work.

Specific Responsibilities – Awards: The committee shall seek out worthy citizens or organizations who have significantly contributed to making the community a better place to live and work. To that end there are hereby created two separate and distinct awards ---The Charlotte Rotary Club Community Service Award and The Clyde A. Fulton Community Pride Award.

A. Charlotte Rotary Club Community Service Award

- This award shall be given to an individual or organization whose actions and leadership have significantly contributed to making the community a better place in which to live.
- 2. The award may be conferred upon worthy recipients not more than monthly throughout the year.
- 3. The committee shall determine the recipient with the consent of the club President.
- 4. The award shall be commemorated by the conferral of a suitably framed Document and presented at a duly called meeting of the club.
- 5. The committee shall see to it that suitable publicity of the conferral of the award is forthcoming thereafter.
- 6. Membership in Rotary shall not be a requirement of this award.

B. The Clyde A. Fulton Community Pride Award

- 1. This lifetime award shall be given to an individual who has so conducted his/her life as to reflect Rotary ideals, service above self and the four-way test, whose life has engendered respect from his/her friends, community, church, business associates, worthy organizations, noble causes and governmental institutions.
- 2. This award may be conferred annually but not more than once to the same person.
- 3. The committee shall provide the research and recommendation of the recipient(s) to the Board of Directors through the President for its determination no later than the first regular meeting of the club in May.
- 4. The award shall be commemorated by the conferral of a suitable plaque to be given at the annual President's barbecue in June.
- 5. The committee shall see that suitable publicity of the conferral of the award shall be forthcoming including a permanent plaque displaying the names and years of acquiring the award to be hung in a prominent place at the regular meeting place of the club.
- 6. Membership in Rotary shall not be a requirement of this award.
