Richard Phillips: Strokes of Freedom Rescheduled

Arrested in 1971 for a murder he didn't commit, Phillips was in prison for 46 years. Creating art enabled him to persist and deal with the injustice of his situation. "I didn't actually think I'd ever be free again. This art is what I did to stay sane," Phillips said. "I could get off into one of my paintings and just be in there for hours." Today, collectors and viewers alike appreciate the beauty he created throughout those long decades and Richard continues to paint.



ArtBreak: Tejer

In anticipation of Wellspring's annual RADFest, hear from this year's RADicle Resident! Puerto Rican movement artist Lourdes del Mar Santiago Lebrón will discuss their new work, Tejer, inspired by the process of weaving. They observe, "Tejido (weaving) relies on pattern making and repetition; the practice, much like dance, requires patience, consistency, and practice. The ephemerality of dance experiences can be exemplified by tejido, as loop stitches are never perfect and can be similar but never exactly the same." Their work explores the ways their

ancestors have actively connected them to land through patterns of repetitive, consistent care, and how these patterns exist, merge, and change within them as a part of an ongoing lineage. Lourdes del Mar aims to create artistic explorations that heighten the senses, provoke inquisition, and demand attention. As a Queer Latine woman, they are committed to making art that is unapologetic, ideally aiding to create a world in which people think longer, feel harder, and experience life without hesitation. A graduate of the Peabody Conservatory at Johns Hopkins University, they are currently pursuing their MFA at Washington University in St. Louis. The RADicle Residency is a collaborative nature-based residency between Wellspring/Cori Terry and Dancers' RADFest program and The Croft of Horton Bay, MI. 




Community Day: Movement and Play



## The Art of Murphy Darden, Sr.

The Art of Murphy Darden, Sr. will be exhibited in the Westin Gallery from, Tuesday, February 4 through February 28, 2025. Stop in to see the work of a Kalamazoo legend Tuesday – Fridays 9:00 am – 6:00 pm. Art will be on sale at the exhibit and proceeds will go to benefit grants programs of the Arts Council. Born in 1928 in the Deep South, Murphy Darden, Sr. was what is sometimes called an "outsider artist," one who has come up outside the traditional art world. He was self-taught, learning about art by drawing as a kid with his twin brother, Irvin. Always on a limited income, he used materials he had at hand.

Murphy was creating and always working on some artistic pursuit or other, right up until he died. The lifelong mission of Murphy Darden, Sr. was to educate us about the cruelty of slavery and discrimination and to celebrate what African Americans were able to achieve in the face of overwhelming odds. He believed in telling the truth about Black History so that it would never happen again. He used his passion as an artist and black historian to educate. He spoke out against the injustices of slavery and the unfairness of discrimination that occurred from the post-Civil War period up to the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s. He believed in telling Black History – the truth of it – as it was and proclaiming the rights gained during the Civil Rights Movement to protect those rights into the future.

The KIA's centennial celebration continues with An Infinite Constellation of Love, opening in the Joy Light Gallery on February 22, 2025. This one-of-a-kind exhibition invites visitors to journey into the dazzling and boundless world of JooYoung Choi's artistry. Visitors are invited to engage with Choi's

interdisciplinary universe of videos, sculptures, paintings, and site-specific installations. Inspired by science fiction, fantasy, social justice, and Choi's personal history, viewers can experience the artist's fantastical realm filled with a cast of characters where art and storytelling converge to spark dialogue around identity, belonging, trauma, and resilience. Through her vibrant imagery and playful sculptures, Choi embraces the beauty of our differences and celebrates the power of connection within diverse communities. At the heart of this exhibition is a profound exploration of family, reimagined beyond the confines of a traditional "family tree." In An Infinite Constellation of Love, Choi invites viewers to consider family as an ever-expanding constellation of relationships—defined not by biology alone but also by shared care, support, and love in all its forms.

Born in Seoul, South Korea in 1982, JooYoung Choi immigrated in 1983 through adoption to Concord, New Hampshire. While completing her BFA at Massachusetts College of Art and Design, Choi returned to South Korea and reunited with her birth family, an experience that shaped her understanding of family and belonging. Since graduating with an MFA in 2012 from Lesley University in Cambridge, Massachusetts, Choi has exhibited in numerous venues, including Crystal Bridges Museum of American Art, Bentonville, AR; Parrish Art Museum, Water Mill, NY; The Contemporary Arts Museum Houston, TX; and The Crow Museum of Asian Art, Dallas, TX, among many others. Choi's artistic practice uses painting, video art, sculpture, animation, puppetry, music, and installations to create an expansive imaginary world called "The Cosmic Womb." Her work has been featured by PBS Digital Studios, YTN (Korean Global News Network), the LA Times, and the Huffington Post. She has received many grants and awards, including support from the National Endowment for the Arts and Artadia, and has participated in numerous artist residencies to expand her artistic vision. JooYoung Choi is represented by Inman Gallery in Houston, TX.

To enhance your experience, the KIA encourages visitors and members to reserve tickets in advance. JooYoung Choi will also present an artist talk on March 20 and lead a family workshop on March 22. Space is limited, and registration is required for all programs.
