For 37 years, the Arts Council of Greater Kalamazoo has presented this outdoor artistic extravaganza featuring over 60 local and regional artists showcasing original paintings, jewelry, garden art, pottery, art demonstrations, and live entertainment! This free, two-day arts-filled adventure is part of downtown Kalamazoo's official JumpstART to summer celebration which features several popular outdoor events including the Do-Dah Parade, Kalamazoo Institute of Arts Fair, Kalamazoo Pride, and Concerts in the Park! Sponsored by Metro Toyota, Southern Michigan Bank & Trust, and the Irving S. Gilmore Foundation, Art on the Mall is located on the downtown Kalamazoo Mall from Michigan Avenue to South Street, and South Street just past the Kalamazoo Public Library to Farmers Alley.

Bonnie Jo Campbell Exhibit @ Kalamazoo Valley Museum Jan 20, 2024 - Jun 30, 2024 Presented by Kalamazoo Valley Museum, 230 North Rose Street, Kalamazoo, MI 49003



Award-winning local author Bonnie Jo Campbell brings her history, as well as many personal items from her writing world, to the Kalamazoo Valley Museum in a mini-exhibit that showcases "What It Means to Be a Hometown Writer." Bonnie was born in 1962 in Comstock, Michigan, and grew up on a small farm with her mother, Susanna, and four siblings (and neighbors and cousins) in a house her grandfather Herlihy built in the shape of an H. Her first collection of stories, Women & Other Animals, won the Grace Paley Prize in 1999, and her book Q Road was a Barnes & Noble Best New Writers selection. Her next novel, American Salvage, was a National Book Award Finalist and won a National Book Critics Circle award. Once Upon a River, released in 2011, was a national bestseller now published in nine languages and has been adapted to film. Her new novel, The Waters, takes place in a Southwest Michigan swamp and was chosen for Oprah's list of Most Anticipated Books of 2024, the Saturday Evening Post Ten Reads for the New Year, and the Apple Books List. The exhibit, through photos, awards, souvenirs from her travels, and other items, showcases her work as well as her inspirations for writing.

The Kalamazoo Concert Band (KCB) was founded in 1961 to provide continued symphonic band experiences beyond high school and college instrumental music programs. The KCB provides competent area wind and percussion musicians with an opportunity to continue performing and in turn provides the community with free, quality musical performances. They have recently added small groups that can be booked for events. Concerts in the Park is a program of the Arts Council of Greater Kalamazoo, with support from the Irving S. Gilmore Foundation, Kzoo Parks, WMUK, Encore Magazine, and the Michigan Arts & Culture Council. It is one of Kalamazoo's long-standing traditions offered in June, July, and August in Bronson Park delivering a unique



offering, unlike any other. Each concert is free and is friendly for the entire family. Picnic meals, blankets, or lawn chairs are encouraged.

There is not a rain site for Concerts in the Park. If inclement weather is expected the concert may be canceled by 2:00 pm that same day.

The work of West Michigan's talented artistic community is on view during the annual West Michigan Area Show. Opening Friday, May 3, this crowd-pleasing annual juried exhibition was carefully curated from more than 300 submitted entries, ranging from paintings, prints, and photos to mosaics, ceramics, jewelry, sculpture, and mixed-media works. This year's juror is Jessica Silverman, founder of Jessica Silverman Gallery in San Francisco. The eponymous gallery was founded in 2008 after Silverman completed an MA in Curatorial Practice at the California College of the Arts, after receiving her BA from Otis College. The gallery represents artists who make museum-worthy art at all stages of their careers.

Awards totaling more than \$5,000, including the \$1,000 Helen Sheridan Memorial Grand Prize, are awarded in recognition of outstanding achievement in the varying media represented in this highly anticipated exhibition. Visit the exhibition before June 24 to vote for the People's Choice Award, which is sponsored by the Arts Council of Greater Kalamazoo. The People's Choice Award winner will be announced at Art Hop on Friday, July 12 at 6:00pm.

To honor of our 100th Anniversary and continue our commitment to presenting the myriad of voices that make up the American experience, the KIA is pleased to present Clearly Indigenous: Native Visions Reimagined in Glass. Clearly Indigenous is a groundbreaking exhibition giving broader and overdue recognition to a wide range of contemporary Native American and Indigenous, Pacific-Rim artists working in glass. The importance, rarity, and excellence of this milestone event are not to be missed. Clearly Indigenous includes nearly 100 glassworks created by twenty-nine Native American artists, four Pacific Rim artists from New Zealand and Australia, along with selections from leading glass artist Dale Chihuly. Chihuly was a part of a collaboration between the Rhode Island School of Design (RISD) and Institute of American Indian Arts (IAIA) which resulted in establishing a glass program and a hot shop for the IAIA.

This stunning exhibition embodies the intellectual content of Native traditions, newly illuminated by the unique properties that can only be achieved by working with glass. Whether reinterpreting traditional stories and designs or expressing contemporary issues affecting Indigenous societies, Indigenous artists have created content-laden bodies of work via the medium of glass. Clearly Indigenous demonstrates the generations of Indigenous artists who have and continue to investigate the expressive properties of glassmaking. Among the artists included in this seminal exhibition are Larry Ahvakana (Inupiat), Dan Friday (Lummi), Carol Lujan (Diné), Robert "Spooner" Marcus (Ohkay Owingeh Pueblo), Lillian Pitt (Warm Springs, Wasco, Yakama), and Preston Singletary (Tlingit). Don't miss this exciting exhibition on view throughout the summer at the KIA! Clearly Indigenous: Native Visions Reimagined in Glass was originated by The Museum of Indian Arts and Culture, Santa Fe, New Mexico. The traveling exhibit was curated by Dr. Letitia Chambers, and is toured by International Arts & Artists.
