Kalamazoo Art League Lecture by Dr. Brian Stewart: Art as Adaptation: San Graphic Traditions in Evolutionary Perspective

Southern Africa is home to some of the world's oldest and richest graphic art traditions. Over the past 50 years, insights from the region have transformed our understanding of rock art worldwide and even changed the paradigm of our species' evolution, shifting our behavioral origins from Europe to Africa and more than doubling their antiquity. Now,

improvements in dating southern African rock art provide the opportunity to link ancient paintings made on the walls of caves with archaeology excavated from their floors. In so doing, we are able, for the first time, to breathe spirituality into an otherwise largely utilitarian and diet-centered record of daily life. This presentation offers an overview of these insights and discusses their importance for viewing art as part of the adaptive repertoire underpinning *Homo sapiens'* evolutionary success. Brian A. Stewart is an Associate Professor of Anthropology at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, where he is also Curator of African Archaeology at the Museum of Anthropological Archaeology. His research explores the deep-time selective contexts and cultural responses that led to the evolution of our species' profound adaptive flexibility. His primary focuses is the archaeology of hunter-gatherers in southern Africa, where he investigates and compares human engagements with highland and desert environments.




<u>Kalamazoo Philharmonia - "Em Português (In Portuguese)"</u> Saturday, November 16, 2024 at 7:30 pm

Heralded in his native land, but virtually unknown on these shores, is the music of Joly Braga Santos. His Fourth Symphony from 1950 is a significant and stirring work, the utterance of a composer enjoying true mastery of this most complicated of forms; based on his Portuguese publisher's records, our performance of it will be the US premiere of this seminal piece. Combined with the Symphony are two shorter works written by composers from Brazil, a country profoundly affected by the legacy of Portuguese colonialism. The first is by Antônio Carlos Gomes, whose opera *O Guarany* – the overture to which we will perform – was called by his contemporary Giuseppe Verdi "pure musical genius." The other is by living composer Clarice Assad, who sought, in her vivaciously rhythmic *Bonecos de Olinda*, to portray the particular traditions of parading puppet figures in the Carnaval celebrations of Northeastern Brazil.

Learn more about glass art with Ekin Deniz Aytac and Joshua Davids! A husband-and-wife team of artists hailing from Edremit, Turkey, and Colorado respectively, Aytac and Davids draw from a unique combination of culture,

heritage, and experience to develop new works of glass art. They have lived, traveled, and created artwork together since 2014. Aytac began working with glass in Istanbul, Turkey, before studying in the Czech Republic and eventually attending the graduate program at West Texas A&M University. Davids discovered glass at the same university while seeking a master's degree in the fine arts. Both artists fell in love with the glass due to its physical nature and the team aspect of creating with the material, as well as its capacity to interact with light and space. In 2015, the couple moved to Kalamazoo to manage Glass Art Kalamazoo, a nonprofit public access glass studio. There they taught classes, created events and demonstrations, and honed their skills in the hot shop before taking their practice independent in 2020. Their work is exhibited in internationally renowned galleries, museums, and private collections around the world.
