Club Member Responsibilities

Financial obligation:

- Annual dues are \$50.00, a portion goes to run Rotary international and a portion goes to run our local club.
- \$100.00 goes to Rotary International
- Continental breakfast served at weekly meetings \$2 for coffee/tea, \$1 for roll
- Each member is invoiced four times a year for dues and fees.
 - o The annual club dues and Rotary International yearly dues are invoiced in January of each year.
 - o The Rotary Foundation \$100.00 contribution is assessed in \$25.00 increments each quarter.
 - o \$100.00 annual contribution to the Scholarship fund in June
 - o Meals you sign up for at other events.
 - o At each meeting you'll have a chance to buy a 50/50 ticket \$1.00 for one or three for \$2.00. The club Sargent at Arms will draw the winning number for half of the pot and a second drawing for \$2.00.
 - If you have the winning number, you draw a card which gives you a
 chance at half the pot. You have a 2 in 7 chance of cashing. If you
 don't win the pot rolls over till the next meeting.
 - o Fines are levied at each for things like having your picture in the

newspaper, or birthdays and anniversaries at \$1.00 for each one.

Once you have become a member someone will reach out to you to go over the financial information.

- Attendance Weekly attendance is strongly recommended. Rotary has a tradition of members attending a meeting no matter where they are in the world.
 If you are out of town use the Rotary International Website to find a meeting near to you.
- Meeting Greeter Every July a new calendar comes out identifying two members are who are responsible to greet the membership at each meeting. If you are unavailable for the meeting assigned, please arranged to trade or have someone cover for you.
- Program Chair Every July a calendar comes out identifying the program chair
 for each meeting. One member is assigned the responsibility to arrange for a
 program for each meeting. Your responsibilities are to identify someone from the
 community or other organization to come in and give a 30-minute presentation.
 You can even nominate yourself to be the speaker. If you are unavailable for the
 meeting assigned please find someone to trade program dates with. If you are
 unable to come up with a program, check with board members or other members
 for ideas.
- Fundraising projects
 - o Sign-up sheets are sent around during our weekly meetings for you to indicate your interest in helping out.
 - o We distribute the proceeds to local organizations/non-profits as grants Key fundraising events include:
 - Scholarship fundraiser in April
 - Blueberry pancake breakfast in July and August?
 - Haven Harvest in October

 - o We provide information during meetings, on Facebook and in meeting minutes where volunteers are needed for other projects.
