THE ROTARY WHEEL



A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made (1905) by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization, Movement and Service work in action." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads.

In 1922, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. So, the present gear wheel, with 24 teeth and six spokes was adopted by the "Rotary International Association." The gear teeth around the outside represent the fact that work is to be done. The six spokes represent the inner direction and path of our Vocational Service, through the representation of our membership via the classification system. Similarly, these same spokes represent an outward distribution path of Rotary's ideals of service and the Four Way Test... going out toward the community, vocations and businesses that our members represent.

A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the keyway was added to signify the wheel was a "worker and not an idler". The keyway in the center of the hub is of great significance, because it represents the individual Rotarian member, who is the key factor in every club. Quality members are the keys, needed for the hub to engage with the shaft and turn, putting the energy into motion and creating the power for the gears to do their work.

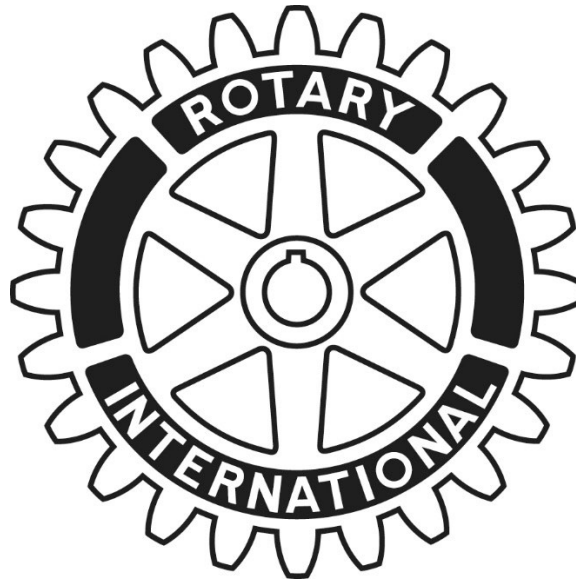
At the 1929 Rotary International Convention, it was determined that blue and gold would be the official colors of the organization, so the wheel was designed with these colors. The four blue bands within the outer radius of the gear represent our four avenues of service. And the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official Rotary International emblem.

The Rotary wheel is also referred to as "The Mark of Excellence".

Some of our local club customs:

I KNOW THESE ARE CUSTOMS but can we get rid of the punitive fines?

- Wear your badge during the meeting. ~~Negligence here is a finable offense.~~
- Greet and shake hands with other members and guests.
- Ask guests what they wish to drink and serve them. ~~If a guest gets their own drink, members at the table are fined.~~ Also, see to it that two guests do not sit next to each other.
- ~~Expect to pay a fine on your wedding anniversary and birthday (unless you bring your Rotary partner to lunch for your anniversary~~
- ~~Advertising your business verbally by name or through wearing apparel w/ logo calls for a fine.~~
- Fellow members are addressed by first names, not last names. ~~(fineable)~~
- If you must leave early, approach the speaker before the meeting starts and apologize for leaving. ~~A dollar fine is also payable at the door when you leave.~~
- A member, when asked to do an assignment, does not say, "No." He/she may get help or find someone else to do the job, but it is his/her responsibility to see that the assignment gets done.
- ~~Additional fines: Late arrivals, allowing your electronic device to disturb fellow members.~~

On this earth is an odd land mass named "Michigan" and within it is the village of 'Vicksburg.' Here a group of business and professional men formed a club for fun, fellowship, and also as a means of working together for their village to accomplish things they couldn't do individually.

The club is a Rotary Club, which means that the members, besides having fun in their meetings and projects, also channel their membership and efforts within a certain framework and emphasize service in various areas such as community, vocational, and international service.

The idea of service to others as a means of dignifying individuals and bettering their lot on earth has a surprising vitality. The first service club in the world was conceived in this land of the 'red, white, and blue' by a group of Chicagoans in 1905. They called it a "Rotary Club." One hundred and fifteen years later, Rotary is in the hearts of more than one million men and women flung to the points of the compass around the world.

Where is the heart of worldwide Rotary? For us it is in our own club in Vicksburg, and the world compass rests here to point us out.

It is here at home we feel the elements of life, love, tolerance and warmth of friendship which sustains us just as the warm, sunshine itself nourishes us. AS the sun-gold field on the banker symbolizes Nature's vital significance to us, the banner itself symbolizes the vitality that Rotary ideals have to life between us.
