Ray Klinginsmith, a retired attorney, served as general counsel, professor of business administration, and dean of administration for Truman State University.

He was director of the Macon Atlanta State Bank in Macon, Missouri, from 1971 to 2008, and is a director emeritus of the bank and a director of the bank holding company.

He is president emeritus of the Chariton Valley Association for Handicapped Citizens. He holds the Great Rivers Council

of the Boy Scouts of America's Silver Beaver Award. A Rotarian since 1961, Klinginsmith has served RI as president, director, Foundation vice chair and trustee, RI Board Executive Committee member, Council on

Legislation chair, International Assembly moderator, RI Convention committee chair, and district governor. He is the first Ambassadorial Scholarships alumnus to serve on the RI Board of Directors.



Klinginsmith is a recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and its Distinguished Service Award. He and his wife, Judie, are Major Donors to The Rotary Foundation.



WHEREAS, The Bloomington Rotary Club was founded in May of 1915 in Bloomington, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the Rotary International motto "Service Above Self" inspires the club's members to provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards, and promote good will and peace in the world; and

WHEREAS, Rotary International funds club projects and sponsors volunteers with community expertise to provide medical supplies, health care, clean water, food production, job training, and education to millions in need, particularly in developing countries; and

WHEREAS, here locally, the Bloomington Rotary Club has, since its inception, focused its efforts in support of youth and those in need; and

WHEREAS, Rotary in 1985 launched PolioPlus and spearheaded efforts with the World Health Organization, U.S Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and UNICEF to immunize the children of the world against polio; and

WHEREAS, each year, the Bloomington Rotary Club sets and achieves a philanthropic goal to contribute to worldwide eradication efforts; and

WHEREAS, these efforts are providing much needed operational support, medical personnel, laboratory equipment and educational materials for health workers and parents; and

WHEREAS, polio cases have dropped by 99 percent since 1988 and the world stands on the threshold of eradicating the disease; and

WHEREAS, Rotary is the world's largest privately-funded source of international scholarships and promotes international understanding through scholarships, exchange programs and humanitarian grants; and

WHEREAS, the Bloomington Rotary Club has, for more than 50 years, presented scholarships and awards to individuals in the community to further excellence in education and public safety; and

WHEREAS, the Rotary Club of Bloomington has served its Rotary District 6490 by providing members active in leadership and service, and the club has assisted in the chartering of many other clubs in the Central Illinois area, thereby expanding Rotary's reach; and

WHEREAS, Bloomington Rotary has a rich history, with roster after roster of outstanding community leaders in its membership, and its success has fostered success in the City of Bloomington;

Therefore, I, Mayor Tari Renner of the City of Bloomington do hereby proclaim May 7, 2015 as Bloomington Rotary Day and encourage all citizens to join me in recognizing the Bloomington Rotary Club for its service to improving the human condition in our community and around the world.
