Program: Girl Scouts of Western Ohio: So Much More than Crafts, Cookies and Camps!

Rhonda Starghill introduced Cindy McCurdy, Dayton Regional Director, who, according to Rhonda, is a professional Girl Scout! She started off as a volunteer and rose through the ranks to oversee 32 counties and to support 2000 girls in 200 troops and 1400 adult volunteers. Their mission is to "...build girls of courage, confidence and character, who make the world a better place." The Girl Scouts partner with a number of organizations who help the girls earn badges.

Cindy described many of the programs sponsored by the Girl Scouts. The Girl Scout Experience is made up of Variety of Activities + Supportive Relationships + the Three Girl Scout Processes (all programs and activities are "girl-led") that result in a strong sense of self, positive values, challenge-seeking, healthy relationships and community problem solving.

In addition to traditional troops, the Girl Scouts offer Direct Service Programming targeted at serving over 600 girls who attend Title One schools. They offer Spring Break and Summer Day Camps, Twilight camps and more.

Camp for Every Girl offers a week at a resident camp for girls who would not be able to participate otherwise. For a fee of \$15, the girls can attend camp and will receive (because of donations!) a sleeping bag, sheets, and other camping gear and supplies to make their stay comfortable. They even send the girls and their families to the camp ahead of time so they know what to expect.

Girl Scouts for Every Girl will send 60 girls for a three-day, 9AM to 3PM camp where they'll be able to make s'mores, hike and swim.

Charlotte, a scout who's in the 6th grade told us about her experiences as a Girl Scout. Her troop built a "buddy bench" (made from 200 lbs. of bottle caps!) which was placed at an elementary school playground. Kids who are feeling lonely can sit on the bench as a signal to others that they need a friend today.

Her troop is also raising money through the sale of 14,000!!!! boxes of cookies to travel to Savanah GA.

As an aside, Fran Rickenbach shared a traveling tip: Offer the flight attendant a box of Thin Mints and amazing things will happen for you.

Charlotte pulled the Queen of Hearts ticket. Dan Zehringer had the winning ticket but pulled the 7 of Spades.
