On behalf of the Rotary Foundation, Frank Scott awarded Amy Radachi and Rebuilding Together Dayton with a Foundation Check in the amount of \$3000. Amy gave a brief overview of this year's successful rebuilding day, the random connections that come of it, and how the grant will be put into good use to continue the mission.

Walt then introduced Mackensie Wittmer, Executive Director of the National Aviation Heritage Alliance (NAHA). Mackensie also serves on the Wright Dunbar Board of Trustees, Dayton Metro Library Foundation, America 250 Ohio Commission, and Wright Patterson Air Force Base Honorary Commanders Program. She wás a 2016 Leadership Dayton and 2021 Leadership Ohio Graduate. The National Aviation Heritage Alliance is the management entity for the Heritage Area. The National Aviation Heritage Area started in 2004 and includes resources like the Air Force Museum, Carillon Historical Park, and Wright State Special Collections and Archives. The NAHA designation will never go away, it is ours forever. NAHA is subject to annual appropriations administered by the National Parks Service. NAHA is 1 of 62 Heritage Areas across the country. Heritage Areas were designed to be an economic strategy to bring federal resources into a region. NAHA currently receives around \$500k per year in federal funding. NAHA is comprised of attractions and resources in 8 counties: Auglaize, Shelby, Miami, Montgomery, Warren, Greene, Clark, and Champaign. NAHA's mission is to preserve and develop the assets in the National Aviation Heritage Area and promote the heritage and future of aerospace. NAHA has

YPALS Day

Saturday, April 22, the 53rd anniversary of Earth Day, District 6670's Youth Peace Advocacy, Leadership & Service (YPALS) Day brought together students from Dayton, Yellow Springs, Oakwood, Fairborn, Beavercreek, Xenia and Cincinnati to explore ways in which peacebuilding and environmental sustainability fit in the 8 Pillars of Positive Peace identified by the Institute for Economics & Peace.

Rotary volunteers and students spent the morning at the International Peace Museum learning about the 1970 creation of Earth Day globally as well as the glacial history and current state of our local water and underground aquifer. During the afternoon, we boarded an RTA bus bound for Five Rivers MetroParks' Adventure Central at Wesleyan Nature Center, where we learned about the park system's Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DEI) audit highlighting the need to plant more trees and remove invasive species to help the urban park flourish, a task taken on by our team with much enthusiasm. Returning to the museum for one last activity, students wrote letters to public officials about issues they felt were important and needed to be addressed in their own neighborhoods.
