- * Public Image Chairs need to update all social media and websites to reflect the new leadership, new points of contact, next year's calendar, etc. I recommend you accomplish this the first week of July. This is also a great time to audit your sites for proper RI branding!
- * Club boards should look at updating your strategic plan and your policy & procedure manuals prior to the new Rotary year.
- * Club Treasurers be prepared to receive and pay District annual dues and RI semi-annual dues in the month of July.
- * Club youth leaders please start planning next year now. Efforts over the summer will provide dividends during the school year. Now that we know what Interact clubs are active, let us push to restart defunct clubs and begin new clubs. Every High School in our District deserves to have an Interact Club!
- * Club membership, please assist your new leadership team as best as possible and help them get comfortable in their new roles.

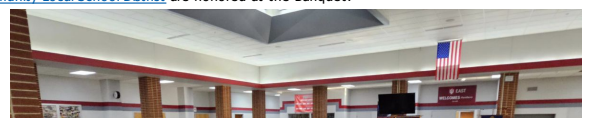
Greenfield and Hillsboro held Annual Radio/Telethon
