President-Elect Richard Wilbourn Introduced Dr. Nelson Atehortua.

Dr. Atehortua is an Adjunct Professor at Jackson State University's Mississippi Delta Center of Excellence in Maternal Health. He is also a health Consultant to the Metropolitan YMCA of Mississippi and the World Health Organization.

Quotes and Notes from Dr. Atehortua's presentation:

"Talking about polio is his passion."

"Polio forces survivors to live in a different world than others."

"As a child, the smell of the hospital was like home; the taste of the food and the everyday sounds were family to me." His time spent in the hospital as a child led Dr. Atehortua to want to be a doctor and a Rotarian. His hospital in Columbia has a large Rotary wheel at the entrance.

Polio Eradication is "almost there" with 99% success; however, in 2023, 12 cases were reported. Reports from 2024 show 61 current cases of polio: 1 in Gaza, 22 cases in Afghanistan, and 32 cases in Pakistan. "The increase in new cases is due to the destruction in civilian infrastructure – clean water, housing, sanitized cooking, etc."

"Rotary International's goal should be to completely eradicate polio by the end of the decade." Of course, Dr. Atehortua has a "biased approach to the goal as a polio survivor."



























Only 12 cases of wild polio were reported in 2023




Six were reported in Afghanistan and six in Pakistan. All cases since 2013 have been caused by type WPV1.



Four more wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) cases reported

The Regional Reference Laboratory for Polio Eradication at the National Institute of Health, Islamabad, has confirmed the detection of wild poliovirus type-1 (WPV1) in three children from Balochistan and one child from Lakki Marwat district of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

The three children affected in Balochistan, include a girl child from Pishin who showed symptoms of polic on September 25, a boy from Chaman, who showed symptoms on September 28 and a boy from Noshki who showed symptoms on September 26, while the affected child in Lakki Marwat is a girl child who showed symptoms on September 29.

The total number of polio cases for this year has reached 37, including 20 from Balochistan, 10 from Sindh, five from KP, and one each from Punjab and Islamabad.

Genetic sequencing of the cases is underway.

These are the first polio cases from Noshki and Lakki Marwat this year, and the second case from both Chaman and Pishin.

Noshki is located on the border with Afghanistan and borders Quetta and Masturg districts

- The Regional Reference Laboratory for Polio Eradication at the National Institute of Health, Islamabad, has confirmed two wild poliovirus type-1 (WPV1) cases from Sindh.
- The two affected children include a girl child from Sanghar district and a boy child from Mirpur Khas district.
- Mirpur Khas district.
- The total number of polio cases for this year has reached 39, including 20 from Balochistan, 12 from Sindh, five from KP, and one each from Punjab and lolamabad.
 Genetic sequencing of the cases is underway.
- These are the first polio cases from Mirpur Khas and Sanghar this year. Sanghar shares a border with Mirpur Khas from where several environmental samples have tested positive for WPV1 since April, indicating virus circulation in this area.
- The intense virus transmission and increase in polio cases is indicative of the harm that children suffer when they miss opportunities for vaccination.
- The Pakistan Polio Programme is launching a nationwide polio vaccination campaign from October 28 to vaccinate more than 45 million children under the age of five against paralytic polio.
