1. Briefly describe the proposed project. What will be done, when and where will the project take place, and how many people will benefit from the project. How will the project benefit the community?

The Rotary Club of Williamsport, MD will be partnering with the Williamsport, MD Food Bank to determine critical food items for distribution to the community. According to unitedforalice.org data from 2022, 36% of Williamsport, MD residents live in poverty or are categorized as working poor and are struggling to afford basic necessities after all household fixed expenses are covered. Food inflation has increased by 25.5% within the last 5 years (according to usinflationcalculator.com) making it even more challenging for our partners at the Williamsport, MD Food Bank to meet the needs of the community. The Williamsport, MD Food Bank will provide a list of critical food needs that the Rotary Club of Williamsport, MD will purchase as well as package and distribute to the community, where needed. The project will take place shortly after their Harvest Hoedown community event fundraiser on October 5th, once funds raised have been tabulated. From there, the outstanding needs of the Williamsport Food Bank will be identified and the Rotary Club of Williamsport, MD will assist in meeting the needs for those items. According to mdfoodbank.org, the average cost of a meal in Maryland is \$3.90. With the projected total funds of \$1,580.00, these funds can provide a meal to approximately 405 individuals. Every meal counts for a resident who is food insecure. This allows the Williamsport, MD Food Bank the ability to maximize support.

2. How many club members will participate in the project and in what role? Is there a cooperating organization also involved and what will their role be?

Approximately 6 club members will participate in the project. Two club members will be performing the administrative and communication duties as they pertain to the outreach to cooperating organization, the Williamsport, MD Food Bank. These club members will report back to the rest of the group regarding what is needed, along with the costs associated with them. Two other club members will be tasked with purchasing the items requested at the most affordable cost to maximize impact. The final two members will take these items and deliver them to the Food Bank or directly to families, depending on what is needed. The cooperating organization, the Williamsport, MD Food Bank, will be responsible for identifying their outstanding food needs and providing a list of items and estimated costs to the members responsible for collecting these details.

3. Will the project be completed if less than requested funds are granted?
