Steve Sheetz, Garrett, and Sam Fiore on the Sheetz Fellows Program. Each fellow needs to have 80 hours of community service. Steve explained how and why the program was formed. 15 students are chosen for each class. Steve lectures 12 times per semester. The students do 360 evaluations and are mentored by community members in a variety of businesses. Normally the group would travel abroad when they are Juniors and Seniors but covid has curtailed this. Last semester they went to Florida. This year they are traveling to Dallas and Austin, Texas. Garrett shared that he appreciates the program because they learn through hands on projects, community service, business events. The fellows are a tight knit group, who builds each other up. They are actively recruiting to the program. Sam highlighted the generosity of Steve and Nancy Sheetz. The Sheetz fellows program impacts lives. A scholarship of 15k is provided per student. As a result of his involvement in the program, Sam has secured a petroleum pricing analyst internship with Sheetz. He hopes to stay local The program has a real ripple effect. Most of the fellows are marketing management- business majors. The program is a toolkit-based way of learning, entrepreneurial way of thinking. They would like to attract engineers, nursing, and other disciplines.
