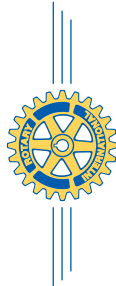

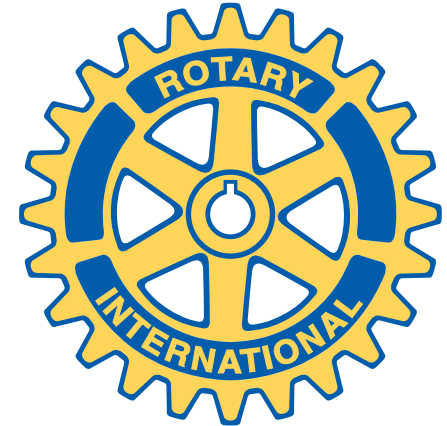

Connie's husband is also a volunteer and she spoke of the enjoyment she gets from teaching. She has received great satisfaction from accompanying a student to their GED graduation or their naturalization ceremony.
