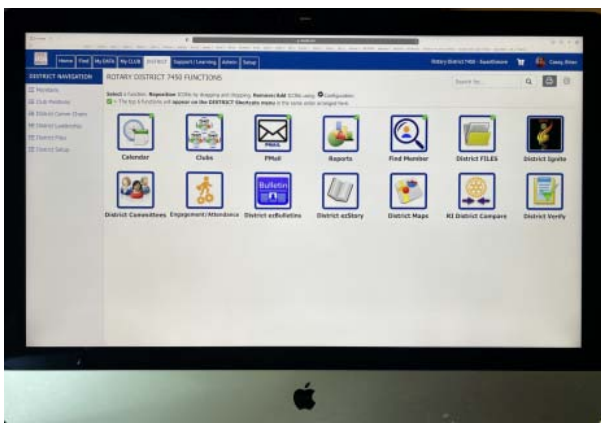

Seeing that the boy could neither walk nor feed himself, his father intended to end his son's life before he became a burden to the family. "My parents had fierce arguments over me," he recalls. "In the end, my mother prevailed. She made the tough decision of divorcing my father to save my life."
