## Program – April 2 by Bob Nath

Past District Governor Tin Lay Raschid and husband Bilal briefed the Club on the history of and recent events in Burma. (The Raschids have a combined 70+ years of Rotary service.) Burma was under colonial rule for 100 years. It achieved independence in 1948 and was a democracy for some years thereafter. The military took over Burma in 1962. Bilal and a group of expatriate Burmese formed the Committee for the Restoration of Democracy in Burma in 1987. Bilal is now the president of the CRDB. Over the years he has worked hard to restore freedom to Burma. Aung San Suu Kyi became the visible symbol of the freedom movement but in recent times has become more of a politician. Recent elections have proved a mixed blessing. There are still many attacks against minorities, including the Burmese Muslims. The military still retains significant controls over the government. Rotary was banned in Burma in mid 1974. Tin Lay and Bilal have been assisting the RI President's Special Representative to re-start Rotary; and there is hope that soon a Rotary Club will be formed in Rangoon. This club promises to have good leadership, but registration has been held up in red tape.
