A SOLID FOUNDATION & PROVEN HISTORY

With decades of experience and strong, consistent leadership since 1982, our Club and Foundation* have the human and financial resources necessary to adapt, face challenges, and carry out large-scale programs.

Although COVID-19 curtailed usual club activities in 2020, we swiftly adjusted to a virtual format and continued our community service focus. Early in the shutdown, we applied for a matching grant through Rotary District 7620 that allowed us to provide \$10,000 to the local RoboBees to manufacture urgently needed face shields and other essential SARS-COVID safety devices for hospitals and healthcare facilities. Later, when it was clear that the shutdown would continue, we quickly turned our efforts to create a safe online auction that made up for some of the fundraising lost due to the cancellation of all in-person events. Our 1st year out of COVID, we put on a very successful US National Oyster Festival, raising more than \$100,000 for community service efforts. Those efforts have included \$50,000 to the St. Mary's County Health Hub for an improved Mental Illness campaign, a \$15,000 donation to the St. Mary's Caring Soup Kitchen, and contributions to 2 churches for nutritional insecurity and homelessness. With this and our existing reserves, we have the funds to support a healthy budget and the ability to move forward for future planning.
