CHANGE IN GLOBAL GRANT FUNDING

The global grants committee recently made a change to the way our district allocates DDF as a portion of Global Grant funding.

Historically, the district has used DDF to fund 1/6 or 16.67% of the total grant amount, going forward the district will fund 1/4 or 25% of the total grant amount.

This change in funding will apply to grants in process and new grants.

Halftime and Wisdom from Mr. Rogers

Halftime is a concept that holds significance both in the world of football and Rotary clubs. While the settings may differ with one being on the field, while the other in the realm of service, the essence of halftime is the same: an opportunity to pause, recalibrate, reflect and prepare for a stronger second half.

In Rotary, halftime can be seen as an opportunity for leaders and members to assess the impact of their efforts, celebrate success, and address challenges. Specifically, when it comes to Rotary Club membership, I would ask club leaders to reflect on 3 questions:

Are your members engaged, inspired and valued?

Are you creating a warm, welcoming environment with engaging meetings?

Are we bringing more people into our club to better serve our community?

Reflecting on the first half of the year, I am truly proud at the great work our clubs are doing to bring more hearts and hands to Rotary. At the time of this writing, **over 80%** of our clubs have maintained or grown club membership this year. In addition, District membership has **increased by 71 members** which is the largest increase in more than a decade!

To finish this year strong, our District Membership Team stands ready to help your club implement any of the 3 C's:

<u>Connect People to Discover Rotary</u> – Hold a 30 -to- 45-minute Discover Rotary session before or after your meeting that explains: Who we are, what we do and the benefits of being a Rotarian.



<u>Create New Pathways</u> – Employ two simple methods. Add an alternative membership type such as: corporate, family, satellite or service, or create an innovative club type such as an alternative meeting time, a cause or interest-based, or an IMPACT club.

<u>Craft the Club Experience</u> – Creating a warm, welcoming environment with engaging meetings is essential to attracting and keeping club members. Surveys suggest reasons people join and stay in Rotary centers around club experience. Meeting enjoyment, providing dynamic, meaningful service projects, building connections and leadership development keep people engaged.

As Fred Rogers said, "I recently learned that in an average lifetime a person walks about sixty-five thousand miles. That's two and a half times around the world. I wonder where your steps will take you. I wonder how you'll use the rest of the miles you're given."


