A professor stood in front of a class with a large empty jar and proceeded to fill the jar with big rocks. Then he asked is the jar full? They said, "Yes."






Next, he poured sand into jar. The sand filled the remaining space. He asked, "Now is the jar full." The students laughed and said, "Yes!"

UNC-G Military Veteran Scholarships Presented by Guilford Rotary Charitable Foundation



On March 25th and April 1st, 2025, The Guilford Rotary Charitable Foundation, part of the Guilford Rotary Club, awarded \$1,500 scholarships to military veterans Rowaida Ashol, Isaac Garcia, Alexander Katers, Antoinette Kellyman, Patrick Maher, Monae McCray, Danielle Parks, Weizhe Qi, Andrew Ramsey, Julissa Rivas, Dylan Soto and Bianca Wade in recognition of their outstanding academic achievements at UNC-Greensboro.

Twice a year Guilford Rotary awards "Student Military Veteran Scholarships" to student veterans to help them as they transition from military service to civilian life as well as to recognize them for their service. Four of the recipients served in the Army, two in the Navy, two in the Air Force, two in the Army Reserves, one in the Air Force Reserves and one in the Air National Guard. The average length of service for the honorees was seven years. The recipients are majoring in Nursing, Psychology, Accounting, Computer Science and Sociology. Two are working on Nursing doctorate programs and the others are pursuing bachelor's degrees.

Since 2015 the Guilford Rotary Charitable Foundation has awarded UNC-Greensboro military veteran students 172 scholarships amounting to \$170,500.
