Program

Sandy had two speakers for this meeting. The first was Frank Heath, the County Manager for Perquimans County. Frank provided an update on broad band expansion through 2 - \$4 million grants, with an additional grant that will take the total to \$12 million. He noted that the water basin has been completed off Granby Street, but sand needs to be moved to where it can be most useful. Water bills will change from postcards to letters. He mentioned the Elections office move & a few other updates. Sandy then introduced Joshua Wheeler, Vice President of the Hertford Branch of the State Employees' Credit Union. It is the second largest credit union in the country with 270 branches serving 2.7 million members. Joshua then spoke about the services provided, which include savings, retirement, checking, lending for autos, mortgages & personal needs, and 1,100 Cash Point ATMs statewide. SECU also offers 1 on 1 financial counseling, investment services, as well as investment, insurance, and estate & trust services. The company takes a personal interest in local communities and provide high school and adult financial training programs.
