## Avenues of Service

We channel our commitment to service at home and abroad through five Avenues of Service, which are the foundation of club activity.

- **Club Service** focuses on making clubs strong. A thriving club is anchored by strong relationships and an active membership development plan.
- **Vocational Service** calls on every Rotarian to work with integrity and contribute their expertise to the problems and needs of society.
- **Community Service** encourages every Rotarian to find ways to improve the quality of life for people in their communities and to serve the public interest.
- **International Service** exemplifies our global reach in promoting peace and understanding. We support this service avenue by sponsoring or volunteering on international projects, seeking partners abroad, and more.
- **Youth Service** recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professionals through leadership development programs such as Interact, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, and Rotary Youth Exchange.

## Rotary Club of Greenwood

### Rotary Club of Greenwood - chartered Feb. 1, 1920



**Club Meetings:** Twice a month on 2nd & 4th Tuesday at 12:00 noon for lunch at Inn on the Square, 104 Court Avenue East, Greenwood

**Qualifications for Membership:** Our club invites community minded people to become members and those who represent various business, professional, and charitable activities in our community. To be invited, you must be sponsored by an existing Rotarian and demonstrate good character, integrity, and leadership; possess a good reputation within your business, profession, and/or community; are willing to serve in our community.

#### Membership Options and Costs

**Active** is the default full club lunch meeting membership. The lunch meeting cost (room rental and meal), RI dues, and District dues are included in the Club Dues.

**Dues:** \$480 per year (minimum of \$120 payable by calendar quarter in advance).

**Initiation Fee:** \$100 (waived when a transferring or former Rotarian).

**Active-Service** is a full Rotary member and part of a Service Member Committee participating in service and fundraising projects of our club, but lunch meetings are not included. Service members hold their own meeting at least once a month for planning and fellowship and it will be “Dutch-treat” for any refreshments or a meal. They are welcome to our club lunch meetings but must pay a **Lunch Fee** of **\$20** if attended.

**Dues:** \$240 per year (minimum of \$60 payable by calendar quarter in advance).

**Initiation Fee:** \$50.

A **Family Membership** includes a **Primary Family Member** and up to two (2) **Family Associate Members**. This membership option allows an Associate to join as a full member but only pay half the dues and initiation. Only one meal per lunch meeting is included. Any one (1) Family member may attend a club lunch meeting, but if more than one attends, a **Lunch Fee** of **\$20** will be required for each over one.

**Dues:** \$240 per year (minimum of \$60 payable by calendar quarter in advance).

**Initiation Fee:** \$50.

**Optional but highly encouraged:** Rotary Annual Fund contribution of **\$100.00** annually (\$25 per quarter if desired), PolioPlus **\$25**, and **\$(your age)** to the Greenwood Rotary Foundation annually.

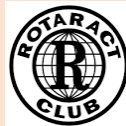
