Duane C. Barney, of DC Builds, Warned us Today of the Dangers of Selecting the Wrong Architect, and Wrong Builder in our Major Home Construction Projects:

Our speaker, today, told us a story about a Redding, CT couple whose dream house turned into a nightmare.



The situation began when the couple purchased the perfect fixer-upper in the right neighborhood, with the potential they had been long looking for. After hiring an unlicensed architect, they accepted his

recommendation for a builder, and commenced on a major home renovation. The results were a disaster, and the bank ultimately ended up taking the home.

Mr. Barney likened the building or major renovation of a residential property to that of opening a small business. Most people don't have the background in doing it right, or worse just take the lowest bid. Even people with good business experience fail, and it isn't surprising that home owners who are naïve about building frequently end up with disasters.

Tary holds the winning ticket, but pulls a losing card. Oh well, there is always next week. Still, he has six more shots at the big one. That's still a winner in our book.



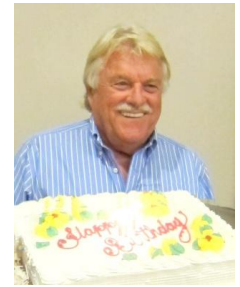

Jim Gargan was our Substitute Sgt at Arms today. He did the job well. More \$5.00 bills are showing up!

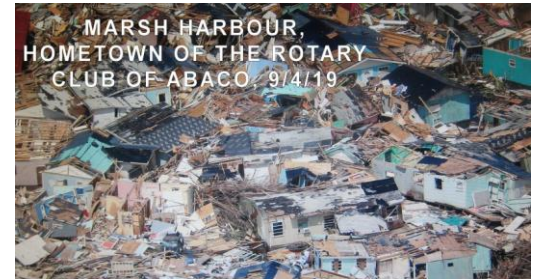

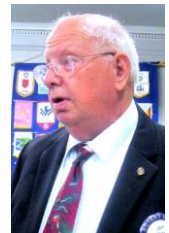
The Devastation in the Bahamas: Rotary is Stepping up to the Plate—

Jeff Kass reminded us to contribute to the RI Foundation. It does so much good worldwide. A \$1,000 gift will make you a Paul Harris Fellow.



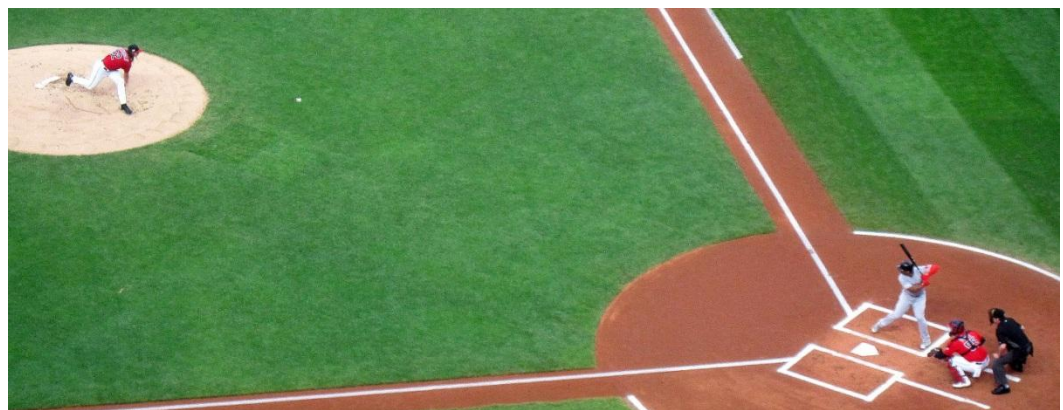
A Little Known fact about Major League Baseball

We were rained out for our yearly Westerner game. Maybe next year will be better. *The 1876 Harford Dark Blues*

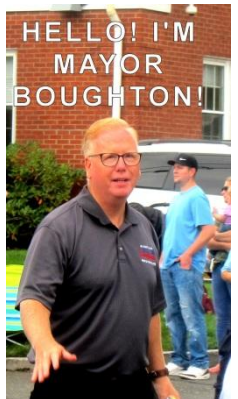
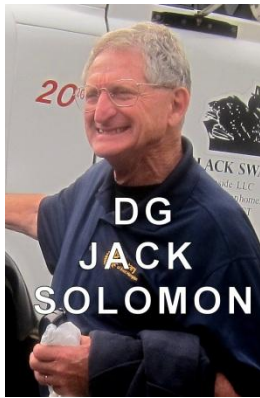
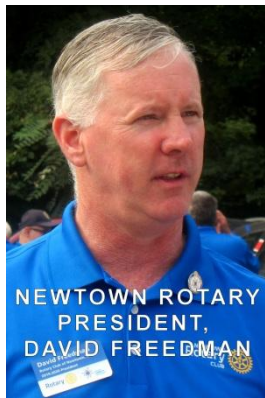
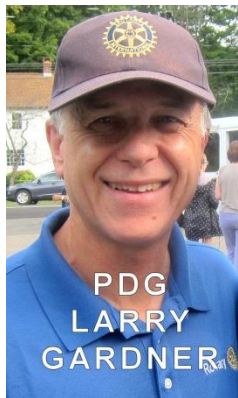
