

A Message from our Incoming President, Frank Scahill:

This year has been incredibly challenging for all of us. The Covid-19 pandemic has saddled us with a number of problems to face, some of which we have been able to overcome, and some of which we just have to accept and incorporate into our lives.



Our club has been meeting on Zoom every Wednesday, at noon, as a result of this. We have done our part to help with the pandemic thanks to Allison Fulton's leadership. We delivered Personal Protection Equipment to skilled nursing facilities that were in desperate need of it. Danbury Hospital, the Community Center for Behavioral Health, and Regional Hospice were recipients of the PPE. We donated over \$1,000 to local food banks. We also pushed through a Rotary Global Grant to pay for approximately \$93,000.00 worth of surgical equipment and supplies for the APROQUEN Burn Center in Nicaragua, a true gift of life inspired by Carl Bailey and his ongoing and really remarkable humanitarian efforts. Our Scholarship Awards are coming to a conclusion within the next week or two, and we will be awarding a number of scholarships to another group of outstanding students in need.

All of the above has been accomplished via the Internet and on the phone. The pandemic has not, and will not stop the 'good' that Rotarians do here, or throughout the world.

Our dues for this year will only be \$150 for all of our regular members--honorary members do not pay. Since we are not being billed for lunches, we have no expenses other than our dues to Rotary International and Rotary District 7980. I will let you know as things progress and the social distancing rules are relaxed—and how we will be handling our meetings in person again. Right now there are no plans to return to the hotel. We suspect it will be no earlier than the end of July and possibly the end of August. We did have a person to person Pass the

Gavel dinner at the Ridgewood which went very well. It was great to see everyone face to face. We will be working on how we can meet and interact safely in the future. There are still a number of unknowns, but we want to be careful about how we make the transition. We are gearing up for our major fund raiser which is the Card Raffle. One of the positives that was forced by the pandemic is an on line program we will be able to use to do virtual fund raising now and in the future. More information on this will be forthcoming.

We still need people to help out with club activities. I will provide information on how you can assist us later. This can be done from home and does not require person to person contact for you to help the club. We want to involve everyone in the club and work on adding membership so we can do what Rotarians do best--help people in need. Not being able to go out does not mean not being unable to help. We can each make an impact and I hope all of you will be willing to lend a hand.

If anyone is in need of assistance for medical supplies or shopping runs, please let me know. If there are any other issues you need help with, please let me know. We will get through this pandemic together.

The Zoom meetings will continue at 621257872, and for the Board 467979495. Join us each Wednesday at Noon—but above all stay well!
