

## Meeting Speakers

Brian Pascal of Tulsa Young Professionals (TYPROs) spoke to us on 1/7/13. This group was created by the Tlsa Chamber of Commerce eight years ago in April. There are about 8,000 people organized into eight "crews" which is what they call their committees. They are ages 21-40 and manage 80 events per year.



Their goals include networking, both social and business, but due to the age group, they find this is mostly horizontal networking and are looking to groups like Rotary to get some vertical networking too.

Community engagement is also a pillar of the organization. this year the Arts and Humanities Council of Tulsa is their primary focus.

They also have a part called "The Forge" the is a small business incubator.

On 1/14 our speaker was Corporal Deidre Hughes of the BA Police Department. She gave us an excellent presentation about conflict resolution. This is something she applies to her work and life and has found ways to recognize an anger blow up about to



happen and then defuse the situation. Respect for others and expecting it in return is a primary foundation for conflict resolution, plus leaving personal ego out of it.

Deirdre's talk fulfills the RI Presidential Citation requirement to have a presentation on Conflict Resolution, part of an international goal promoting world peace.




Our 1/21 meeting was a presentation of "The ABCs of Rotary" by our membership committee. Led by Matt Hancock, we
