Janie Thomas spoke to us on 3/11 about the Broken Arrow Arts & Humanities Council. It's a packed year of events and coordination with the chamber, cirty, museum and school.



Broken Arrow Police Chief David Boggs spoke on 3/25. He gave us an update on the changes that have occurred during his first year as chief. Some of the highlighted achievements include scrambled communications to keep internal messages secure, mobile data and the Public Safety Center contracts approved with opening expected in early October. Also on that list is budget planning around the failed bond issue, and a rewrite of the policy manual. In an effort to prevent unused prescription drugs from falling into the wrong hands, a drop box is available at the police department office.

Congressman Jim Bridenstine spoke to us on 4/1. One of his topics was the dangerous way the government is keeping interest rates low by buying bonds with "air funds." He had several people with him who offer help to those he represents, Gabe Sherman, Tulsa Area District Director, Brian O'Hara, business representative, Kathy LaFortune, medical/Social Security local support and Ben Couric, a D.C. rep. marketing. She had a big part in making our early Trivia Contests at NSU-BA successful.




Elisha Tyler of Service Master & Recovery Services is a transfer Rotarian from Muskogee. Her hobbies are sports and gardening.
