John was born and raised in Bristow where he currently resides with his wife and daughters.

He stays active in his children's lives and his family enjoys spending quality time together outdoors. John's daughters are involved in sports and the family also enjoys hunting and fishing activities. His grandfather started Anchor Drive Inn in Bristow and the restaurant remains family owned and operated. After graduating from Bristow High School, John attended East Central University in Ada, OK before beginning his career as a Police Officer.

John has served as a Police Officer in Bristow and Enid and has spent the last several years with the Creek County Sheriff's Office working under the current Sheriff, Steve Toliver. Steve has served since 2000 and will not be seeking re-election on June 26th.

John hopes to continue the great work that Sheriff Toliver achieved during his three terms. Over the last twelve years, Sheriff Toliver and his staff oversaw the building of a new county jail that can house three-hundred inmates, improved communications between the county and other federal and state agencies, and began the process of creating a new juvenile detention center. The construction on the new juvenile detention center is slated to begin in fall 2012. These are some examples of the undertakings in the Creek County Sheriff's department.

John does not plan to make major changes if elected. However, he hopes to be able to enhance and build on the momentum from the current administration.

In addition, Brooks Mitchell, candidate for Corporation Commission, attended Friday's meeting as well. Brooks is from Seminole and lives in Oklahoma City with his wife and two daughters. He is a Certified Public Accountant and has run a private practice for over fifteen years in Oklahoma City. Brooks has served the Oklahoma Corporation Commission for nine years in various Director positions and as an administrative aide to a former Commissioner.
