#### Need Money For Local Projects?

In 2004-2005, District 5300 will be receiving a DDF (District Designated Funds) check from Rotary International for the second year. This new program replaces the CAP Grant and the New Opportunity Grant programs and allows us to decide how this portion of our DDF will be spent (\$25,000 in 2004-2005). A district committee will review the grant applications and rank the applicants. Local projects will receive priority in funding (matching grants and individual grants are still available through RI for International projects). The deadline for applications to be received is July 31, 2004 - this deadline will NOT be extended. Forms and information are available on the district web site at www.district5300.org under the "Rotary Foundation" and "Grant" headings. If you received a DSG in 2003-2004 and have not submitted your report(s), your Rotary club's application(s) will not be considered. Report forms are found at the same location on the district site.

### Group Study Team (GSE) to Travel to Korea

Our Rotary District 5300 has teamed up with District 3650 (Seoul, Korea) for Rotary year 2004-2005 with our team departing October 30, and returning on November 29, 2004. This ensures our team attending the Korean District Conference. The first step is to select a GSE team leader. The team leader is involved in the selection and is responsible for the training of his/her team. We have a request from the governor in Korea that we put together a team made up of middle school and high school teachers. The ability to speak Korean is not required but certainly would be helpful. Deadline for team leader applications to be received is April 30, 2004. Interviews for the GSE team leader will be held May 15, 2004 at the Green Tree Inn, in Victorville. If you know of a Rotarian who has an interest in becoming a GSE team leader, they should contact Margaret Cooker, 760-243-5928 or mcooker@rotarymail.net as soon as possible. This is an honor as well as a wonderful experience for a Rotarian to travel as a GSE team leader to another country. GSE is one of the programs of the Rotary Foundation. Travel, as arranged by RI, is paid for by the Foundation and the group stays with Rotary families in the host country. There are some costs to the team leader and to the team members - a summary of which can be found in the GSE material. Applications for team members must be received by May 31, 2004. The interviews for team members will be held in June. Date to be announced. Once the teams members have been selected they must attend at least 12 hours of training. The GSE team members must be between 25 and 40, work in their given profession, and be a US Citizen. For further information about GSE. please refer to our district web site www.district5300.org/gse. District 3650 will be sending their team to the United States around April 23-24, 2005 so they may attend our District Conference.
