

Rotary World Peace Scholarship Applications Available

Applications for Rotary World Scholarships are now available for the 2005-2007 academic term.

The scholarships are for study at one of the seven Rotary Centers for International Studies in Peace and Conflict Resolution to obtain a two-year mater's-level degree or certificate in international relations, peace and conflict resolution.

During their studies, selected Rotary World Peace Scholars will work to advance knowledge of issues related to peace, causes of conflict and world understanding. The Scholars will participate in a Rotary Center Seminar and will commit to a care related to international relations, peace and conflict resolution.

Rotary World Peace Scholarships are for two academic years and provide funding for round-trip transportation, tuition and fees, room, board and other limited expenses.
