The Aberdeen Rotary Foundation awarded a \$1000 grant to McDermoth Elementary for the purchase of additional e-readers that are used to support new student readers with a read-along system. Technology like this can be crucial to helping students develop their skills, especially if they have reading challenges or learning difficulties.
