Program: Rotary in Action - Fred Balz Community Grants

President Corrina introduced Mark Elliott and Skip Steffen. He and Skip Steffen have been involved with the club Foundation for quite a few years. The focus of the presentation today is on the club grants, not the grants funded by Rotary International. Mark reiterated that these are two important and separate pots of money (with separate funding sources).

Between Fall 2023 and Fall 2024 the club had funding requests for both Impact Grants and Response Grants. Mark and Skip are two members of the Grant Committee. Mark invited club members to join the committee if they are interested. He and Skip thanked club member Curt Andino for being the newest committee member.

Out of the 8 applications for Impact Grants 6 were funded at a total of \$45,000. For the Response Grants the club had 11 applicants totalling \$27,000. The committee funded 5 of those requests at a total dollar amount of \$9,000.

Leslie Baker at the South Sound YMCA joined the meeting to speak about the work at Plum Street Village and the impact that the Fred Balz Community Impact Grant in Spring 2023 had on the residents at Plum Street Village. Leslie shared the YMCA focused on engaging the residents of Plum Street Village to join the YMCA with the goal that they will be able to join and participate in a community activity.

Leslie shared that one of the biggest barriers to participation is a fear of integration, as these individuals worry about how they will be received. Some residents have simply been trying to keep themselves warm. The YMCA works hard to create a welcoming pathway. The Y has launched specific classes for Plum Street Village residents and found ways to provide exercise clothes and equipment. When asked about the specific clothing needs Leslie said that for shoes men's sizes 10-13 and Women's sizes 6-9 are needed, and all types of men's and women's athletic clothes. If you'd like to drop off a donation, please do so directly at the Plum Street YMCA and clearly label the donation for Plum Street Village residents.
