Program: Mongolia - Karen Fraser

Judy Henderson introduced Karen Fraser, her neighbor and a long time public official who is now retired. Karen is now a trustee at The Evergreen State College. Karen served for 24 years in the Washington State Legislature first in the state house and later in the state senate. Karen is also a former Thurston County Commissioner.

Karen Fraser spoke about her 19 day trip to Mongolia with friend and longtime resident Sandra Romero. Mongolia is on the northern border of China between China and Russia. When ruled by China the country was split between what is known as Inner Mongolia and Outer Mongolia. Inner Mongolia has since been absorbed into China. Outer Mongolia is the region we now know of as Mongolia. 40-50% of Mongolians are nomads. Children attend boarding school in town. The capital city has about 1.5M people. The city is heated by coal fired boilers/steam. This is the reason that the city cannot build a subway system. Gridlock is seen as almost constant. Mongolia is very active in the United Nations and has strong relationships with countries around the world, including the United States.

After her time in Mongolia, Karen flew down to visit the Gobi Desert. You can drive anywhere in the desert. It is the fifth largest desert in the world.
