Our dynamic Rotary District 5030 Environmental Sustainability Committee is very active this year and is inviting members of our club to participate in a hands on environmental project on April 19 from 9-1 pm.

We will be working on the banks of Seattle's only river namely the Duwamish River. Our work will include removing invasive species and planting indigenous trees and shrubbery. This is a District-wide project and we need 40 volunteers to join us.

At the beginning at 9 am, we will have George Blumberg, historian with the Port of Seattle, share an update on the major cleanup being coordinated by the EPA as a Superfund site. We will also have someone from the Duwamish Tribe share about the native history going back 10,000 years in connection with the Duwamish River.

There will be coffee and donuts in the morning, followed by vegetarian lunch around noon.

Please let Dave Spicer know if you are interested. This is first come first serve and expect to hit 40 volunteers very quickly as we anticipate Rotarians from other clubs will want to join in the action.

Only need to bring boots appropriate for working in the mud and working gloves plus a water bottle. Tools and porta-potty on site.

This is a very meaningful outing and definitely helps our environment!

Last Friday, we inducted **JACKSEN LUND**. With him was his sponsor, Lisa Latchford, as well as his mother, Christina Lund, a member of the Rotary Club of Eugene.

Jacksen is a Philanthropy Officer with Evergreen Goodwill. Did you realize that Evergreen Goodwill of Northwest Washington celebrated their centennial in 2023? The organization has evolved dramatically throughout the past century, but one thing has remained – their commitment to serving the community by breaking down significant barriers to education and employment. Did you realize that it was in 1979 that Evergreen Goodwill launched vocational training classes for anyone facing barriers to education and employment? Jacksen is passionate about job force development.

He told me he got into development for a couple reasons.

He was helping his mom with fundraising. He went to college to become a public servant. He worked with nonprofits more than with government. Evergreen Goodwill and its mission were a good match for him.

He is one of three people in the individual giving area. He also handles planned giving, corporate giving, and the scholarship program. Practically, that means he spends a lot of time talking to donors, organizing the scholarship committee, and reaching out to corporate donors for the annual gala.

He is a 2021 graduate of Seattle University. He enjoyed the holistic mindset that Seattle U uses to approach each student—which meant learning in classes not obviously relevant to his major.

Why Rotary? His Mom is a Rotarian in Oregon. He sees our club as a great way to build a circle of people who want to make our community better. Hands-on community volunteering interests him.

Jacksen grew up in Eugene Oregon, attending Marist Catholic High School.

Something you wouldn't know about Jacksen: He was in a rock band in high school for two years...mostly classic rock. He sang as well as played the bass and the guitar occasionally.


