David Snow

Bringing clean-air wood-burning stoves to Blanca Flor community in Guatemalan highlands

David is a Renton Rotarian, formerly with Tacoma #8. He has worked in development for World Vision, and is currently with Wesley Homes.

Four decades ago, David served 3 years as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Guatemala -- as a business advisor to a federation of agricultural co-ops.

Forty years later, he returned to the Mayan Highlands with a West Seattle Rotary-led project with the Hands for Peacemaking Foundation to install clean-air wood-burning stoves and water filters.

In May 2024 David and 13 other Rotarians traveled to Guatemala to install 106 Aller clean-air wood-burning stoves in the small remote community of Blanca Flor. Blanca Flor is 16 hours north of the capital via bus!

Fifty-two percent of the equipment and supplies budget of \$48,000 was funded by Rotary Clubs. University Rotary was one of those participating and funding Rotary Clubs.

The stoves were designed in Everett and are manufactured locally in nearby Barillas, Guatemala. They use 50 percent less firewood, cook 40 percent more efficiently and, importantly, with proper venting negate smoke-caused respiratory illness - especially in women and children. The Rotarians split into teams of three and, with a factory rep and a village assistant, spent about 45 minutes assembling and installing each stove - with hikes on narrow steep trails in between dwellings.

Rotarians on this team also distributed over 125 backpacks filled with school supplies to school kids, in addition to soccer balls and basketballs. On the last day in the village they distributed six gradients of reading glasses (at times using an interpreter to translate from Spanish into Q'anjob'al, the locally spoken Mayan dialect) to those needing a pair to sew or read... if able.

It was a rewarding trip and they enjoyed a little R&R afterwards on Lake Atitlan and in the old colonial capital of Antigua. The team indeed helped transform lives.

David will be back in May of 2025, with five other Rotarians and the Hands for Peacemaking team, to install 110 stoves in the nearby village of Saclecan.

2 Ways To Donate Clothes and Household Goods *(by Rick Jones)*

Over the past year our club has been working closely with two entities that re-purpose and distribute lightly-used clothes and household goods. It's easy to access and here's how to do it:

Solid Ground works to help folks settle into a permanent home, often for the first time. Their clients are coming from short-term housing, incarceration, or a refugee situation. These folks need all the items it takes to establish a home, often for a family.

Used but working small appliances (coffeemakers, toasters, toaster ovens, hand mixers, blenders, etc.) along with dishes, glasses, cutlery, bakeware, pans, etc. are all needed. Additionally, clothes that are workplace suitable are needed for both men and women.

The **University District Family YMCA** works in our neighborhood and is directly helping people, often in deep poverty and often living on the street or in cars. They have an appetite for warm clothes and rain resistant clothes for both men and women. Especially sought after are belts and shoes/boots.

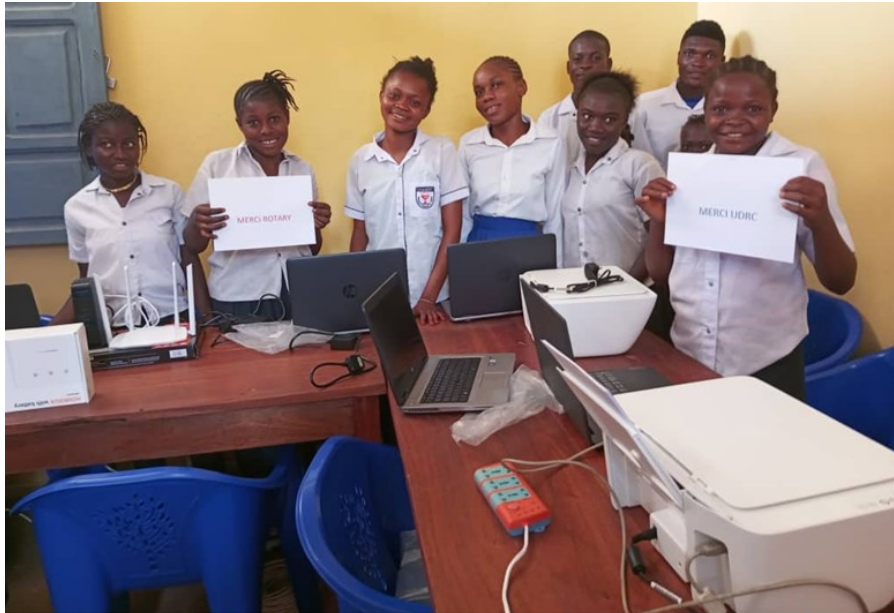

International Service Committee Project Completed in Congo

Early this year, the Ekanga-Mbandaka Rotary Club of the Democratic Republic of the Congo completed an education project which our club helped fund.

The project provided computers, printers, tables, chairs, solar electricity and an internet connection for a computer lab at the ILELA Institute, a secondary school in the Bongondjo district of Mbandaka. Now the students and teachers at the Institute have a facility where keyboarding skills and use of computers in a work setting can be taught in a hands-on environment. In addition, students and teachers from nearby schools can use the lab for a fee when the ILELA

Institute is not using it.

The students studying at the ILELA Institute come from poor families of local residents and are primarily the children of fishermen. They normally complete their primary studies (at the Bongondjo primary school) and their secondary school studies without touching a computer keyboard. Even though they follow the Commercial Curriculum which includes basic education and science classes, they do so without using computers or other digital tools. Thus, prior to installation of the computer lab, the teaching and learning remained theoretical.

The ILELA Institute has about 500 students and 22 teachers. In addition, it is estimated that approximately 1,500 students from different institutions in Bongondjo will use the lab.

Our club contributed \$7,275 to the project and the Ekanga-Mbandaka Rotary Club contributed \$300, along with project oversight.

Our club sponsors were Linda Harris and Seth Barribeau. Our club has helped fund several projects with the Ekanga-Mbandaka RC over the last five years. Our contact with the Congo club is Rotarian Blaise Bonkangu Boambo.
