### **Club Fundraising**

Darryl Bishop, head of our fundraising committee, gave a presentation to the club looking for fundraising ideas.

We have done major fundraising in the past that we should be proud of, such as the Moir Park Field House, which was a \$235,000 project where we ran a car raffle for

a 1965 restored Ford Mustang (which Roger Brown's son won). We used to run a wine and art sale which produced a modest profit, our assistance to the Cranbrook library in running their annual book sale put about \$6,000 in our coffers each year. Our discount golf cards brought in about \$2,000 - \$3,000. For a couple of years, we did parking at Kootenay Ice games, running the Moir park concession.

As a result of the Elko train project running over budget by \$60,000, the Kootenay Rockies Gran Fondo emerged to pay the money owing on the train project. This year will be the 10th riding of the fondo.

Ramden Estate is not really fund-raising but the scholarship likely originated because of the Rockies Film Festival (Claire Ramdin appreciated what Rotary was doing). Our scholarships are only partially covered by the Ramdin Estate scholarship fund.

Why we raise funds - because supporting community, international and youth projects costs money. We cannot rely on the fondo each year as we have had to cancel it in previous years due to forest fires, the risks and the smoke.

This year the fondo is hoping to raise enough funds to contribute to the Cranbrook and area Hospice house that is in the works. Thus the striking of the fundraising committee to come up with ideas through the membership.

The club was shown a list of potential fundraising ideas and each table was asked to pick one that they would be interested in. The fundraising suggestions were to be broken down into 1 minor and 1 major fundraiser. The tables suggested the following: Diamond dinner, Eagles boxing charity challenge(annual event), Rubber duck race, Dine Cranbrook/Kimberley and a 50/50 during the Gran Fondo, small couples dinner, a larger garage sale and soup for the soul.
