

Cranbrook Female Hockey Development Program

Bobby-Jo Hekob with the Female Hockey Development program, told us that recruitment for young females to join hockey is extensive and must be relentless and almost pushy. Typically, males are signed up at age 5 because that's kinda what you do in Canada. It seemed like girls had more options in dance, gymnastics and now horse riding and swimming which are very competitive.

Bobby-Jo is trying to provide a place of camaraderie for girls, just like she enjoys with women's recreational

hockey. She found that the girls enjoy being together and like the color pink, so she ordered pink jerseys to entice the girls to be a team. Nathan Lieuwen of the Cranbrook Bucks, helped her develop a logo, which is basically the same as the Cranbrook Bucks logo.

Most of the girls that sign up are new to hockey and skating. Mentorship is a huge part of the program as girls see other girls skate and playing well is crucial to the development of female hockey. "See Her, Be Her", is a slogan that resonates with the girls. No one goes off the ice without a fist bump.

Bobby-Jo tries to work only with female coaches. To help out, you do not have to play hockey to coach. She has hired power skating people to assist as well. She has had some push back from dads wanting to coach, but from her experience, girls develop more confidence when it's a level playing field. Girls are very vulnerable, and they get focused and concentrate on themselves better with a female coach. With a male coach they shrink and think they can't do that. For the first five years it was all female coaches. But eventually she ran out of people.

The girls have a ton of other sports that compete with hockey, so it must be special and fun. They don't even know they are getting exercise; they are just playing hockey. They are like sponges, taking in information and asking a lot of questions. They love to hear that they are doing a great job and she teaches the girls that helping someone does not have to be for social media. They do lots of fundraising, but they also help when they can. For example, they work the kettles every year for the Salvation Army. She asks them not to post the photos as they need to do it because it's something they should do, not just for attention.

They also have a BBQ in the fall and a jamboree at the end of the season. The jamboree is for all Kootenay girls which includes skills, fitness, games, yoga or dance, and lunch. They raise money for others.

She follows the Hockey Canada Guide. Hockey Canada runs Echo Fun Days, which is a skills day just for fun.


There were no questions, but Mel was attending via zoom from Ontario, she thanked Bobby-Jo and praised her work.
