## Our meeting this week: APOPO, mines, rats and dogs



More than 60 countries around the world are contaminated with the detritus of war: hidden landmines and other explosives. These are the hidden hazards of conflicts recent and decades old, that cause tragic accidents and hamper communities from developing their productive land.

Emma Mortiboy, our speaker this week, will be sharing with us the

story of APOPO, an international organization that is saving lives through the deployment of scent-detection animals: dogs and rats.

A dog's scent ability, we've long known about. But rats, which once helped carry the plague that devastated the world, can also be a great partner in helping to detect mines and sniffing out disease.

APOPO animals can help detect another type of plague by bringing a better, faster alternative to the slow and often inaccurate detection methods that make tuberculosis the world's most deadly infectious disease. 10.6 million new people contracted TB in 2022, 3.1 million went undiagnosed, and 1.3 million died from the disease.
