On Tuesday (February 18), every club member will receive an email with all the details about the project



At our February 11 meeting, our speaker was club member and Past President Beth Roessner, the CEO of the <u>Berkeley Chamber of Commerce</u>. Beth's topic

was the historic relationship between Berkeley Rotary and the Berkeley Chamber, and the activities and work of the Chamber. She was a lively and witty speaker, as we have all come to expect.

Immediately preceding Beth's presentation was a memorial tribute and moment of silence for the late Polly Armstrong, a Chamber CEO who preceded Beth. Polly, a former long-time City Council staffer and then Councilmember for the southeast campus and neighborhoods, and Rotarian club member, died on Sunday, February 9. Beth added her own memories

of Polly early in the talk, and later praised Polly for persuading the local Chamber to become independent of the National Chamber so it would not have to be wed to the national Chamber's sometimes too right-wing views, which made the Berkeley Chamber less effective in fighting for business in our liberal community. <u>Read More</u>

Did you know there are Rotary Fellowships for Beards and Moustaches, Performing Arts, Hiking, Home Exchange, and Coffee Lovers? Rotary Fellowships are international affinity groups that unite Rotary members and friends around a shared hobby, identity, vocation, or culture. Rotary's 110+ Fellowships offer our members and their friends meaningful experiences by providing fun and diverse ways of participating in Rotary and offering them opportunities for connection with like-minded individuals through in-person and online experiences.

Rotary Fellowships exemplify Rotary's inclusivity by welcoming any interested individual regardless of their Rotary affiliation and showcasing the many vocations, cultures, identities, and interests represented by the Rotary family. In 2024, 110 Rotary Fellowships engaged more than **54,000 people** across 150 countries in building communities around shared passions and identities. Of the 54,000 reported participants, 89% were Rotarians, 5% were Rotaractors, and 6% were non-Rotary members. Fellowships also offer leadership opportunities to our members and participants. Last year, Fellowships engaged 867 Rotarians, 19 Rotaractors, and 45 friends of Rotary in leadership roles. And women hold more than 30% of leadership roles across Rotary Fellowships. Read More
