Foundation Update

Craig Henderson, Club Foundation Chairman was pleased to report that the club's donations to the Rotary Foundation total \$7,175 to date toward the Board's \$10,000 goal for this Rotary year. Sign up on rotary.org to donate monthly.

Craig also announced that the club is 94% towards the \$1500 giving goal for every Rotary Club which has been requested by Rotary International. Well done everyone!

The President's Advance which was to have been held this coming weekend has been canceled due to the wildfire disaster. Clubs were given the option to receive a refund for the registration fee or to donate those funds to the new District Disaster Relief Fund. The Board of your club has voted to donate those funds to the Disaster Relief Fund.

Per Dennis Franklin, Rotary International does not generally see itself as a first response organization. Rotary International and District 5300 are putting pieces into place so that they are ready to respond when the ongoing need becomes more clear. Besides the Disaster Relief Fund, the District is finding warehouse space in order to be able to collect and store supplies, creating a transportation and temporary housing/relocation source for Rotarians and working on public image so that Rotary can let the community know what resources will be available. Also tragic is the devastation of the Altadena Rotary Club. Fourteen of its members have lost their homes. The club has lost its meeting place, all their club history, bell, supplies and flags. Information on how we can help is also forthcoming.
