
APU Athletics- Gary Pine

The Glendora Rotary Club was treated to a fascinating insider's look at collegiate sports by Gary Pine, athletic director of Azusa Pacific University.

Gary paid his way through APU by working in the Athletic Department and discovered a love for college-level athletics. He started his career at APU and after a detour to USC and later the Big West Conference Office, he returned to APU.

APU offers Baseball, Basketball, Cross Country, Soccer, Tennis Track & Field for men. For women, there is Acrobatics and Tumbling, Basketball, Cross Country, Soccer, Softball, Swimming, Tennis, Track & Field, Water Polo and Volleyball.

There are 350 student athletes, 200 are women and 150 are men. Gary shared that these are challenging times for all institutions of higher learning and particularly Christian ones. There are many fewer students than there were pre-covid. Gymnastics and Football are not offered due to the cost of running those programs.



relationships which inspire transformation of student-athletes through experiencing Christ and cultivating competitive excellence, equipping men and women who are ready to serve and prepared to lead. What was so striking about Gary's presentation is the honesty with which he shared that the athletes who come to APU do not generally go further in an athletic career. This is what makes the mission so vital...sports are seen as the vehicle for teaching readiness to serve and lead. You might even say "sports with a higher purpose".
