

ITT Africa School of Health Science, Technology and Innovation

Zubair Bakubye, offered the background for a global grant for Bugiri Ŭganda, global grant ITT Africa/ Bugari Uganda. Came to the US for school via scholarships. Sub-Saharan Africa faces severe education challenges, with high illiteracy rates

and limited access to schools and educational materials. **Specifically in Bugiri, the community faces:**

- **High Education Exclusion:** Sub-Saharan Africa has the highest rates of education exclusion globally, with 182 million illiterate adults and over 20% of children aged 6 to 11 out of school (UNESCO).
- **Skills Gap:** Traditional literacy is no longer enough—digital literacy is now essential for success in modern workplaces and economies.
- Lack of Teacher Preparedness: Many lack the training to effectively integrate digital tools into education.
- Future Readiness: Millions of students and adults are unprepared for the demands of a technology-driven world.
- **Growing Inequality:** Without access to digital education and resources, the gap between potential and progress continues to widen.

Accessibility to education and educational materials is very difficult. Growing inequality of everyday Africans gaining education. Utilizing local people / assets. Considering sustainability. Teacher training, nursing training. Mothers of peace, former girl soldiers training teachers with computer skills. Menstrual pads are being made (as a social enterprise).
