International Committee Update

Did you know that the district has a pool of unused DDF funds that any club is able to apply for? When this incentive first launched a couple of years ago, the International committee requested \$5000 to help support a WASH project at the Shree Purnasanjiwani Lankhanamai School in Dhulikhel, Nepal.

Last month saw the completion of the WHO Standard Toilets for this WASH project. Separate toilet buildings for boys and girls were constructed. In the female toilet section, 4 female urinals, 3 stool toilets, 1 disabled-friendly toilet, a pad incinerator, and a handwashing station were installed. In the male section, there are now 5 urinals, 2 stool toilets, 1 disabled-friendly toilet, and handwashing. Altogether, 16 toilets were handed over benefiting 375 students. Previously, there were only 2 toilets and one open urinal for students.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony was held with the founder mayor of Dhulikhel Municipality, who was also the second president of the Rotary Club of Dhulikhel. He was interestingly, the first person to construct a toilet in Dhulikhel. Past President Ranjeev Shrestha, PE Dr.Anish Joshi, VP Manish Yogal, a representative from Dhulikhel Municipality, and the Dhulikhel Chamber of Commerce were also present.
