# Weekly Trader Joe's Food Pickup for IMPACT of So. AZ

It is hard to believe, but children and their families in Tuscon go to bed hungry. In fact, the Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona serves more than 18,000 people in Pima County every month, with a 30% increase in need over the holidays. For the last eight years, the Rotary Club of Oro Valley, along with Interact students, have gone to Trade Joe's every Saturday morning to pick up food for the IMPACT Community Food Bank - an estimated 26,000 lbs of food per year. # **April's Rotary Theme: Maternal and Child Health**

Every day, mothers risk their lives giving birth, and millions of children die from preventable causes. At least 7 million children under the age of five lose their lives each year due to malnutrition, inadequate healthcare, and poor sanitation.

Rotary is committed to changing this by providing immunizations, antibiotics, and access to essential medical services, while also supporting trained healthcare providers for mothers and their children.

One powerful example of Rotary's impact comes from **PDG Joe and Brigitte Hentges** from the **Dove Mountain Rotary Club**, who traveled to India in 2018 for a National Immunization Day (NID).





community at a time.

Reflecting on the experience, Joe described it as "life-changing—an unbelievable opportunity to save children from disease." While working in the Mewat Muslim slums near New Delhi, they provided polio and other vaccinations to children under five. When Joe asked aid workers why Rotary was serving in these communities, the answer was clear: "These families don't trust government workers—but they trust Rotary."

Sustainability is at the heart of Rotary's efforts. By empowering local communities to take ownership of healthcare training programs, we create lasting change. That's why Maternal and Child Health is one of Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus. Through service, trust, and action, Rotarians are making a difference—one child, one mother, and one
