From mobile prenatal clinics in Haiti to mobile cancer screening units in India and home birth support in Nigeria, Rotary members are making a real impact—ensuring mothers and children have a healthier future.

Closer to home, our own clubs are making a difference! The **Arizona Diaper Bank** benefits from the generosity of Rotarians—just last June, the **Tucson Kino and Tucson Sunset Rotary Clubs** collected over **14,900 diapers and supplies** for women and children in need. This fall, the **U of A Rotaract Club** stepped up by collecting feminine hygiene supplies for their Period Poverty Project to be distributed across Tucson.
