Stephanie Theis, LCSW, with Children's Haven of SW MO, is a strong advocate for Proposition A, which will be on the Jasper County ballot on April 8th. This crucial measure seeks voter approval for a quarter-cent sales tax to establish the Jasper County Children's Services Fund, generating \$5 million annually to support local children. Currently, Missouri Kids Count ranks Jasper County 98th out of 114 counties for child well-being—highlighting the urgent need for action. The fund will expand access to mental health services for thousands of children and youth while also creating jobs. Additionally, it will provide critical resources to protect young victims of crime, abuse, domestic violence, homelessness, and suicide, offering hope and a fresh start for both children and their families when they need it most.
